2. Staff Studies and Estimates. None.

3. Local News Papers. A unit news paper was published daily by the Communications Section until 8 October 1965. Production was ceased due to a lack of equipment and a shortage of paper.

4. Photographs. None. This unit does not have a photographer attached or assigned.

5. Journal. No journal is maintained as such. A chronological record is maintained of all messages received in this command, by month.

6. Discipline, Courts-Martial, OH

a. No unusual disciplinary problems.

b. One General Courts-Martial completed; one Special Courts-Martial pending two Summary Courts-Martial completed and three Summary Courts-Martial pending.

c. No Battalion Commander's OH, eight Company Commander's OH.

7. Morale, PX, Postal Affairs, Liberty, R&R

a. Morale in this command is considered to be extremely high.

b. PX Services. The PX in the Regimental area is used by personnel of this command. Arrangements have been made to have a mobile unit visit each company once a week. This service is working satisfactorily.

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c. Postal Affairs. Mail service is adequate in all respects.

d. Liberty. There is no liberty policy for this command.

e. R&R. Monthly quotas for R&R flights to Bangkok, Hong Kong and Okinawa are received and filled by this command. R&R flights are a great morale booster for all hands.

8. Chaplain Support, Religious Services, Schedules.

a. The Battalion Chaplain scheduled and conducted Protestants services for the CP and company personnel during the month of October. He also scheduled Catholic Mass for CP and company personnel.

b. A total of 22 services were held during the month of October, with a total attendance of 546 people.

9. Civil Affairs, Military Government, Community Relations, Results of REDCAP Progress, Supplies distributed, projects completed and in progress.

a. Civil Affairs. Chaplain SEELAND has been assigned as the Battalion Civil Affairs Officer. Chaplain SEELAND's Civil Affairs activities for the month of October are as follows:

1. 15 October. Setup Long Binh Counterpart Committee consisting of Long Binh Hamlet Chief, Roman Catholic Lay Leader, Buddhist Lay Leader and Hamlet School Mistresses.

2. 21 October. Arranged for psy war film and lecture presentations in Long Binh school house with support of Long Binh Counterpart Committee.

3. 23 October. Arranged for distribution of clothing and toys through Long Binh Counterpart Committee.

4. 23 October. Long Binh psy war lecture presented in school house at 1930. Approximately 75 Vietnamese were present.

5. 23 October. Distributed pencils and sharpeners. (Gift of Coronado 7th grade) to school children (63) of Long Binh.

6. 26 October. Delivered clothing, books and toys to Counterpart Committee of Long Binh. 3/3 provided Marines to guard material and keep order during distribution. Counterpart Committee distributed goods to the people of Long Binh. Approximately (400) people received goods.

b. Military Government. None.

c. Community Relations. A more active Civil Affairs and REDCAP program during the month of October has greatly increased the feelings of the local people towards the Marines.

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d. Results of MEDCAP progress, supplies distributed, projects planned, completed and in progress.

1. MEDCAP. The Battalion Aid Station has established a MEDCAP schedule in the An Tan, Long Binh area. During the month of October, BAS personnel treated approximately 1300 people.

2. Projects planned, completed and in progress. With the help of the Battalion Civil Affairs Officer, Chaplain SWELAND, arrangements are currently being made to establish a small dispensary in the An Tan, Long Binh area. Negotiations are underway with the hamlet chiefs to find a suitable location. It is intended initially to operate the dispensary only during daylight hours. The hamlet chiefs are trying to find interested personnel who would be trained by BAS personnel and eventually operate the dispensary with little or no help.

5. Journal. No journal is maintained as such. A chronological record is maintained of all messages received in this command, by month.

6. Discipline, Courts-Martial, OH

a. No unusual disciplinary problems.

b. Two General Courts Martial pending; one Special Courts Martial and two Summary Courts Martial completed.

c. Three Battalion Commander's OH, two Company Commander's OH.

7. Morale, PX, Postal Affairs, Liberty, R&R

a. Morale of this command is considered to be extremely high, considered in light of the following:

b. PX-this command is serviced by a static PX located in the Regimental area, approximately 1 mile from this unit. Periodically, a mobile unit services the individual companies. However, it is inadequately stocked in all respects.

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c. Postal Affairs. Mail service is considered good. Mail normally is received twice daily.

d. Liberty. Due to the tactical deployment of this unit, no liberty policy has been established.

e. R&R. This unit receives monthly allocations of R&R to Bangkok, Hong Kong, and Okinawa. Quotas are always filled.

8. Chaplain Support, Religious Services, Schedules

a. The present chaplain reported aboard 14 September 1965. On 18 September 1965, Lt David A. SEELAND, relieved Chaplain SMITH as Battalion Chaplain.

b. Since Chaplain SEELAND has been with this command, he has assisted in establishing a medical clinic in conjunction with the Battalion Civil Affairs Program. Also, he has established liaison with civic and religious leaders of the two primary hamlets of the TAOR. (See appendix C)

c. Religious services are conducted every Sunday; this includes Vespers and Divine services. The schedule is promulgated each Friday by the Battalion Chaplain.

9. Civil Affairs/Military Government/Community Relations. Results of MedCap Progress, Supplies distributed, projects planned, completed and in progress

a. Civil Affairs. This unit has recently been assigned a new TAOR. Two hamlets within this area have been selected for future Civil Affairs Programs. (See appendix B, par 7) At this time plans are being made for the initiation and development of the program.

b. Military Government. The single Military Government structure in this area is on the district level, and is maintained by the Republic of Vietnam. A working relation has been established with the district chief.

c. Community Relations. The relations between U. S. Forces and local indigenous personnel are very good. No positive information regarding the relations among the local hamlets is available for this report, however, it is felt that relations are good.

d. Results of MedCap progress, supplies distributed, projects planned, completed and in progress.

(1) MedCap. A MedCap program in the TAOR has recently been established and is progressing smoothly. A program of a minimum of three visits a week has been established by the Battalion Surgeon. This is the most effective Civil Affairs Program in the TAOR at this time.

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(2) Supplies distributed. Supplies for Civil Affairs were received by this unit on 1 October 1965. Distribution is in the planning stages.

(3) Projects planned, completed and in progress.

(a) Projects planned encompass the reconstruction of damaged buildings and the construction of new ones. There are no projects in progress and none have been completed.

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S-2 CHRONOLOGY

1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- a. Operation Triple Play: See After Action Report # 40, INISUM # 153, Special Intelligence Report of 29 October 1965, and SITREP # 152 and # 153.
 - b. Operation Triple Threat: See After Action Report # 41 and SITREP # 155.
 - c. Chu Lai Airfield Raid: See INISUM # 162, # 165 and SITREP # 158.
2. NEW DEVELOPMENTS. VC employment of small sabotage/suicide teams to attack and destroy aircraft on the Chu Lai Airfield is the first employment of this type unit in this area.

3. PROBLEM AREAS

- a. AN/TPS 21. During the period 1 October to 31 October this battalion has had the use of only one of the two AN/TPS 21 ground surveillance radars authorized. One set has been dead-lined for repair in excess of one month and the remaining set suffered nearly daily maintenance problems so that it actually has been in operation less than 40% of the hours of darkness. Experience has proven that the AN/TPS 21 suffers from fragility and unreliability of components and is easily put out of action by heavy rains, heat or prolonged high specific and relative humidity. Virtually no component of the set is trouble free. Particular attention is directed to the failures inherent in the generator which should be the most reliable component, but is not capable of sustained operation. A revamped generator, designed specifically to run for periods in excess of 12 hours, with simplified maintenance requirements and an initial allowance of two generators per radar set is desirable. Many of the breakdowns are related to failure of resistors, capacitors and fuses. Simplified detection and replacement of these parts with test and replacement facilities on the battalion level is imperative. The present T/O allows the battalion only one radar technician MOS 5931, however experience has proven that one technician is required for each set and if sufficient spare parts and diagnostic test equipment were made available, along with suitable spare components, a third technician working on 3d echelon maintenance at battalion level would be desirable. This would permit utilization of two sets and repair of component parts simultaneously. An alternative would be a maintenance float of components available at a higher local level.
- b. Interpreters. The shortage of interpreters has made collection of information from indigenous personnel, functioning of civil affairs

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program and liaison with local Vietnamese forces difficult. Immediate remedial action is necessary. This situation could be most quickly solved by employment of english speaking Vietnamese in far greater numbers. Alternate solutions that should be pursued simultaneously are training Marines in Vietnamese, and English language instruction for Vietnamese. Neither of these solutions is ideal but the present intolerable situation has had a most deleterious effect on some aspects of this units operations.

4. TERRAIN: The TAOR remains as reported in the Command Chronology for September. The 3d Battalion, 3d Marines TAOR is bisected by a major stream, the SONG AN TAN which flows north through the narrow neck of the TAOR from (BT 497057). Just about midway between this point and distributaries of the SONG AN TAN and SONG BEN VAN is the hamlet of AN TAN which provides a market place along Highway 1 and the railroad. The railroad crosses SONG AN TAN on a metal bridge that could be converted by moderate engineer effort to give it the capability of carrying wheeled vehicles. The bridge is almost 100 meters long. A similar but less strong highway bridge 50 meters north carrying highway 1 traffic over the SONG AN TAN. The river is crossed by many native boats also. The river is, at this point, a tidal estuary, effected by the tides of the South China Sea. From reports it is fordable at low tide at points south of the bridges. The Highway bridge has a limited capacity and is one way for trucks and vehicles.

Highway 1 throughout the TAOR is asphalt paved, approximately 4 meters wide, all weather two way road with narrow sand shoulders. The only major stream crossing is at AN TAN and, leaving the TAOR at the northwest, at the ONG BO Bridge over the SONG TRAU.

The railroad is part of the Vietnamese meter gauge system and parallels Highway 1 throughout its course through the TAOR. Neither the road nor railroad have vegetation along their routes for any appreciable distance. Both are raised several feet above the surrounding terrain.

East of the SONG AN TAN the TAOR is sandy dunes with sparse vegetation. Dunes are mostly low rolling and wind blown. Along the beach dunes some pine trees are found. Trafficability is fair for tracked vehicles and after rains or when the sand is wet, trafficability is increased.

West and North of the SONG AN TAN the lowlands are sandy with generally lower dunes. The sand appears to be more from broken-down marble with a rather regular crystalline structure. It packs hard and in places water pools stand after rain. This is facilitated by the lack of slope and relatively shallow water table.

Hill 69 (BT 468068) and the ridges radiating from it dominate the immediate terrain west of AN TAN Hamlet. These hills are covered with scrub brush several feet high providing minimum concealment from air observation and fair concealment from surface observation. Observation and field of fire from Hill 69 are good. It is currently garrisoned as an observation post.

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Directly west of Hill 69 is the Hill 100 complex. These hills are generally heavily vegetated and difficult to traverse. Vehicle trafficability, both tracked and wheeled, is extremely poor. Observation from these hills is lacking due to height of the brush, and off trail travel difficult. Soil of all upland areas is mainly lateritic clays.

The trail net shown on the standard tactical map of this area is reasonably accurate and displays of drainage nets is very good however relief and terrain representation are not always completely adequate for tactical use partly due to vegetation being mistaken for terrain and partly due to the choice of contour intervals of the scale used. Hamlets types are basically three within the TAOR:

- (1) Agglomerated Farm Hamlet
- (2) Dispersed Farm Hamlet
- (3) Linear Hamlet

The Agglomerated Farm Hamlets are found through the TAOR except in that portion east of the SONG TRAU and North of Highway 1. These hamlets are characterized by close grouping of houses with small table vegetable plants and shrubbery, bushes and trees separating houses. Houses may be undetectable at 50 meters due to denseness of separating vegetation. Often these hamlets are raised above paddy levels.

The Dispersed Farm Hamlet are distinguished by individual houses set amongst the paddy and cultivated fields. The houses are usually surrounded by tree or bush hedgerows that provide a wind break and screen. This type hamlet is found in the area east of the SONG TRAU and north of Highway 1.

The Linear Hamlets are oriented along Highway 1. Most of this development is devoted to commercial ventures, at present dealing mainly in items for Marines but also some services and trade for indigenous personnel.

AN TAN Hamlet furnishes a market and commercial center for the LY TIN District. It is a densely populated built-up area and the largest population concentration in the TAOR.

5. WEATHER. In the month of October precipitation totalled 17.92 inches. Rain fell on 17 days during the month. There were ten days with measurable rain and seven days with a trace of precipitation. The maximum temperature was 82.3 F. The average relative humidity was 92%. There were ceilings less than 3000 feet 15% of the time. Ceilings were less than 1000 feet and/or visibility less than 3 miles 42% of the month. On 22 October, as a result of heavy rains, the streams crossing the MSR at (BT 532082) washed out a culvert with a cross section area of approximately 30 square feet. This washout necessitated erection of a temporary panel bridge on the MSR. It points out the potential dangers from underestimating run off in coastal and piedmont area streams.

ENCLOSURE (2)

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Increases in stream flow may be seven or eight fold almost overnight. Winds were generally light, from the Northeast. Winds of sufficient force to blow down tents occurred in conjunction with the rains that destroyed the culvert. Property damage was light being limited largely to torn tentage. Weather, while a factor in helicopter operations, did not interfere with the tactical operations of this battalion and exerted only moderate influence on logistical and administrative functions.

6. INTELLIGENCE SUMMARY

a. VC activity during October consisted mainly of small arms fire from small groups or individuals, resulting in little more than harassment of units.

b. There were 21 VC initiated incidents in the TAOR during October. These consisted of:

(1) 17 isolated small arms fire incidents

(2) 2 ambushes (see INTSUM # 146 and # 147)

(3) 2 attacks, one on a PF unit vicinity (BT 417122) on 20 October (see INTSUM # 155); the attack on Chu Lai Airfield on the morning of 28 October (see INTSUM # 162 and # 163).

7. TARGET INFORMATION. No significant targets were reported during October.

8. PATROL REPORTS. Attached as Appendix (1).

9. DAILY INTELLIGENCE SUMMARIES. Attached as Appendix (2). # 136-166

10. SPECIAL INTELLIGENCE REPORT. Attached as Appendix (3).

11. A. O. REPORTS. On 271730H October, an A.O. reported what appeared to be a radio antenna vicinity of (BT 360064). Aircraft was fired on by small arms fire in low passes over area.

12. PRISONER REPORT. There were a total of 73 VCS and 8 VCC apprehended during the month of October, all were turned over to higher authority.

13. ENEMY CASUALTIES. There were a total of 30 VC killed by actual body count during the month of October in the Battalion TAOR. (1 by aircraft, 2 by artillery and 9 by PF).

14. CAPTURED EQUIPMENT

a. Weapons: There were a total of 7 weapons captured during October. These consisted of 1-French MAS 36, 2-CHICOM 7.62MM Carbines, 3

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Thompson Sub-Machine Guns, 1-U.S. Caliber .30 Carbine. (The last by PF).

- b. Supplies: There were 2 rice caches found during the month (INTSUM # 144 and # 149), totaling approximately 4½ tons which was re-distributed by the 4th Marines to local populace. A cache of salt totaling approximately 1 ton was also found (INTSUM # 149), but being in solid block form and unmovable, it was destroyed by burning with captured VC kerosene (approximately 30 gallons).

3. a. AT 0905H, COMPANY "I" PLATOON SIZE PATROL RECEIVED FOUR (4) ROUNDS SNIPER FIRE FROM VILLAGE VIC (BT 452074) AS THEY WERE CROSSING THE RICE PADDIE VIC (BT 453073). NO ROUNDS WERE RETURNED BY THE PATROL SINCE THE FIRE CAME FROM A VILLAGE AND THE PATROL COULD NOT SEE WHERE THE VC FIRE WAS COMING FROM.

CHARACTERISTICS OF AREA OF OPERATION

Weather: During the first day weather was a minor factor in tactical operations as it did not reach extremes of temperature or humidity to a degree that it affected troop efficiency. Likewise there was no noticeable effect of weather on the V.C. Helicopter operations were feasible and conducted throughout the daylight hours of the first day. Rain commenced shortly after 181700H and continued most of the night, reducing visibility and making conditions for the troops less than ideal but not materially affecting their efficiency or hampering the units tactical employment. Helicopters operated until 1830 without great impairment of efficiency due to rain or humidity but it should be considered that all lifts were personnel or internal cargo. No tactical use was made of land vehicles.

Terrain: The terrain shown on the VIETNAM 1:50,000 L701 Series Sheets 6757 III and IV is basically accurate. However, on Sheet 6757 III in Grid Square 3612, 3712, and 3713, the representation of relief is so far lacking in detail that it fails to represent the terrain sufficiently for tactical use. A trail is shown from (BT 365132) southeast to (BT 375127) which does not exist. Hydrography is accurately portrayed except that during the wet season much of the terrain is flooded in varying degrees from several inches to several feet and streams may become obstacles to foot or vehicle traffic. Most of the terrain would be only marginally passable to vehicles in the cultivated areas due to soggy soil and dikes during the wet season.

The villages are not located in reference to a roadnet but are isolated or semi-isolated houses connected by a trail net and distinctly separated by dense shrubbery, trees and hedgerows. Shrubby and trees near the houses include pineapple, manioc, various palm trees, thorn bushes and fruits. By their density, thorns, and mass they present a problem in troop movement presenting concealment and cover to the enemy and channelization and obstacles for our personnel. The hedgerows, at gaps and gates make excellent sites for ambushes, mines, and booby traps should the V.C. decide to use them. Cultivated lands are largely devoted to rice divided into moderate size paddies with dikes raised more than one foot above the paddy bottom in most places and as high as three feet in some. Other crops include sweet potatoes, manioc, beans and various table vegetables, with tree crops limited to the immediate vicinity of the houses. Observation, except where limited by housing and surrounding trees, is good. The vicinity of the built up area it varies from feet to yards. The slopes of the hills south of DUC BO are brush and grass covered. On the higher hills where slopes are steeper the brush cover is thicker and brush may be up to five or six feet high. Brush is mixed, many thorn bushes and grasses. Area south of DUC BO and north of hills is used for cattle grazing. Some of the streams have trees along the banks. Visibility is good from slopes with excellent concealment in the brush. From high ground south of DUC BO in (BT 3513 and 3612) and NUI MIEU at vicinity (BT 3815) observation of the entire objective area is possible. From NUI MIEU observation of Highway 1 and the railroad can be obtained.

There are no paved roads in the objective area. Some of the trails are wide enough for M422 or M274 traffic. The trail leading from the mine (BT 364, 133) northward might support light vehicle traffic. Helicopter landing zones are available throughout the area in drier paddies and the cultivated dry crop areas. The slopes are used for grazing and where cleared, make excellent landing zones.

Streams flow generally southward but meander greatly as shown on the maps. Stream bottoms are generally muddy and soft. Some of the smaller streams are fast running. Most stream banks are steep making crossing by vehicles doubtful or difficult. In the dry season general trafficability would be greatly increased throughout the area and many of the streams could be completely dry. SONG BA TUC and SUOI VAO DOI are the major streams in the area. Both join the SONG VINH AN at the north of the objective area.

The area is devoted mainly to rice culture. No market areas were located. No industries except farming were noted. At the south end of the objective area at (BT 364133) a mine is located on the west bank of the SONG BA TUC. This mine shows no evidence of recent working or any activity other than the effects of air and artillery bombardment. A single smokestack approximately 25 feet high and six to eight feet in diameter remains. One cave was discovered and several smaller holes were found that may have been the remains of smaller mining attempts. What appears to have been a brick kiln was located near the mine and smokestack. It was destroyed as it would have been easily convertible to a defensive position.

The local populace was not seemingly hostile to Marine units or individuals upon entry into the objective area. The attitudes and actions of the PF accompanying the Marines acted to the detriment of relations with the area inhabitants. Seizure of property and intimidation of the people did not serve any obvious purpose. Property was seized as VC without the owners being held by the PF as VCS raising the suspicion that the property was being appropriated for PF use.

ENEMY SITUATION. Enemy dead were identified by the villagers to the PF and interpreters as members of the VC 802D Regiment and/or 152D Company. These were the V.C. killed by Company "M" 3/3 during the afternoon of 18 October. Villagers stated that the V.C. were in the hills to the south of UUC BO during the morning of 18 October. They said the V.C. entered the hamlets at night. There were several extensive trench lines dug with three and four strand barbed wire and some with thorn bushes and punji traps used to supplement the barrier. The trench lines are oriented to defend built up areas. Many of the better, most used trails had fighting holes dug at irregular intervals along the sides under overhanging bushes or in the shadow of hedgerows. One VC mine/booby trap was encountered by Company "L" 3/3 at (BT 382145). This mine was found at 181230H and blown in place by engineers. It was a booby trapped punji pit. Another mine was located at (BT 364145) and destroyed. A third boobytrap was found at approximately 181700H at (BT 372137) and blown in place at 190700H by engineers. This boobytrap was a rifle grenade, possibly of French manufacture, placed with the give up so anyone jumping into the foxhole would detonate the device.

No indication of total enemy strength in the objective area was obtained. The VC were able to move ahead of the sweeping force successfully until late in the afternoon when the VC became trapped in approximately squad strength on the peninsula formed by the SONG BA TUC, SUOI VAO DI and the SONG VINH AN. The group was killed or captured. These VC attempted to hide by submerging wholly or partially in the rice paddies and had to be found almost by stepping on the individual. It is likely since the operation did not begin until 1100H, many of the VC were already in the hills south of the objective area as a normal part of their daily routine or after being alerted by the preparation of the landing zones. The information obtained from the villagers

indicated that the main body of the force was in the hills since morning. Since the number of weapons recovered was limited to two, one MAS 36 carbine and a CHI COM 7.62MM carbine, both taken by Company "L" it is reasonable to assume the VC were able to hide their weapons in either prearranged and prepared hiding places or, hastily by throwing them into flooded paddies. Company "M" recovered two M-26 U.S. fragmentation grenades, and a third was detonated by the VC from whom they were recovered. The VC was killed by his own grenade.

The VC force in and around DUC BO was not aggressive and defended with only sporadic small arms fire. It adopted passive withdrawal and escape and evasion tactics. No attempt was made to reinforce the personnel in the DUC BO area or to actively assist them by neighboring forces. It would appear likely that the VC was able to extract the majority of his forces from the DUC BO area or to conceal them from our search but it is obvious that he suffered disproportionate losses of personnel and prestige. The DUC BO complex now must be considered a dangerous area for troop concentrations by the VC.

The mine area centered at (BT 364133) which has been the site of several artillery and air bombardments shows no signs of V.C. attempts to utilize the main shaft which is a vertical mortar and brick shaft 12 X 12 feet in area descending vertically approximately 60 feet to mortar and brick bottom. It appeared to be partially waterfilled. No evidence of side galleries or material from recent mining or excavating was found. The product of the mine is unknown. A strongly built brick and mortar smoke stack is standing approximately 75 meters northwest and up hill from the main shaft. Another cave located at (BT 362134) 25 to 30 meters deep cut into solid rock that could not be destroyed by available explosives was located by Company "M". It had been occupied apparently by VC. The shaft was essentially horizontal. A brick furnace that could have been used as a bunker at (BT 362131) was blown by the engineers.

A cave at (BT 366127) was partially destroyed by 140 pounds of C-4. It was probably an abandoned mine of some type. The cave was horizontal tunnel running 30 meters into the hillside then making an 80 degree turn to the right and proceeding for an unknown distance. This tunnel may have at one time gone completely through the ridge, emerging in a slide area on the other side that showed evidence of having been a part of a mine tunnel. There was some evidence of use of the cave, one ceramic bowl and a single rubber tire sandal found near the mouth of the cave. The cave entrance was 10 feet wide by 6 1/2 feet high. There was no evidence of detritus from the mine near the entrance but the interior showed evidence of use of explosives in its construction. There were no tracks or rails for mine cars and no evidence of mine cars. The interior of the mine was shored with 6x6 timbers in selected spots. The floor of the mine was damp clay without tracks indicating any use. There is evidence of three or four simple lean-tos capable of holding four or five men each at (BT 364129). These shelters had been collapsed by removing the supports but could be easily re-erected. The area also showed evidence of cooking fires. No evidence of the purpose of the shaft was found. Probably these shafts are used by the VC part time. An "L" shaped cut approximately five and one half feet wide and four feet deep increasing to 12 feet deep at the deepest is cut into the hill at (BT 373123). There is evidence of a small fire having been built in this cut. There is no evidence of the cut ever having been covered and probably was made as part of a mining or quarrying operation.

VC ACTIVITY. Company "L" reported that alongside the trail 80 meters from a CHICOM grenade rigged as a boobytrap (BT 364145) a bamboo marker was found. The marker was a "U" shaped bent bamboo laid on the ground with the closed end toward the device. A boobytrapped punji pit at (BT 382145) was marked similarly but with two short pieces of bamboo placed parallel within the "U". This marker was found 180-190 meters from the device. Both devices were destroyed by engineers.

At coordinates (BT 364145) the VC have constructed 32 well camouflaged fighting holes with bushes tied over them. The holes are eight to nine meters apart, sited to cover the river which, in this area, is chest deep. One sniper fired from this area during the sweep.

A "Maylayan gate" was found near these positions with a vine trip wire four and a half feet above the trail. The vine had three knots of bamboo fibers around it and was easily seen and deliberately tripped without injury to our troops.

Overt VC reaction to "Operation Triple Play" was largely scattered sporadic rifle and automatic weapons fire. No evidence of a concerted defense were encountered.

CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

1. It is urged that S-2 scouts continue to be employed as intelligence and information collecting, recording, and reporting agents with the companies. It is recommended that two or three man teams be formed for this purpose.

2. It is strongly recommended that aerial photos both vertical and obliques be obtained of all possible operating areas and hand held obliques of particular targets to be used for briefing and planning. Hand held photos are particularly useful for landing zone selection and briefing of pilots. For most practical value at least five prints each are needed. The quick response of the AO section was very helpful but it is on an unofficial basis with inadequate support and immediate steps should be taken to furnish this section with developing and printing support necessary to fulfill its mission and capitalize on its potential.

3. If polaroid cameras were available for use by scout teams much information could have been instantly recorded and comparative photography of certain areas obtained that would enhance the value of intelligence reports and efforts.

4. Continued surveillance of the mine shaft area at (BT 364133), the ridge line from (BT 365130) to (BT 372124) and the paddy area within 500 meters around (BT 372124) may develop information on the VC activity in this area. The paddy lands at these coordinates do not present the appearance of regular tending usually found in the villagers fields and there were no used trails into the area so they might be VC rice supplies.

ON THE RIGHT FOREARM AND RIGHT SIDE OF CHEST. DELIVERED TO ITT.
 - c. AT (BT 434089), FOUR VCS APPREHENDED FOR LACK OF I.D. CARDS (NID).
 - d. AT APPROXIMATELY 0700H, WHILE PLATOON WAS SEARCHING AREA EAST OF
HIGHWAY # 1, AFTER DISEMBARKING FROM TRUCKS, THE TRUCKS RECEIVED
FIRE FROM AN UNKNOWN NUMBER OF VC. FIRE WAS RETURNED BY THE TROOPS
AT THE TRUCKS. A WOUNDED GIRL WAS DELIVERED BY HER FAMILY AND
EVACUATED BY THE TRUCKS. WOUND DID NOT APPEAR TO BE SERIOUS.
 - e. THE UNNAMED STREAM FROM VIC (BT 431088 - 431092) IS FORDABLE BY
FOOT TROOPS. SEVERAL SMALL FOOT BRIDGES CROSS THE STREAM IN THIS
STRETCH. BUSHES, SMALL TREES AND PLANTS LINE THE STREAM
BANKS MOST OF THE WAY. WATER IN MOST PLACES IS APPROXIMATELY FOUR
FEET DEEP. BOTTOM IS MUDDY. WIDTH IN MOST PLACES IS ABOUT FOUR
TO FIVE FEET BUT WIDENS TO 12 TO 15 FEET IN SOME FLOODED AREAS.
 - f. THE KNOB AT (BT 433089) HAS A THICK HEDGEROW RUNNING ALONG THE
WESTERN BASE WITH FIGHTING HOLES DUG BEHIND THE HEDGE EVERY 10
TO 15 FEET. MOST ARE FILLED OR PARTIALLY FILLED WITH WATER. ONE
OR TWO PUNJI TRAPS LOCATED BETWEEN HEDGEROW AND STREAM. NO SIGN
OF OTHER BOOBY TRAPS.

- g. PADDIES ARE MOSTLY FLOATED NOW BUT SANDY AREA NORTHEAST OF KNOB AT (BT 433089) PROVIDES EXCELLENT HELICOPTER LANDING ZONES.
- h. HOUSES IN UNNAMED HAMLET NORTH OF KNOB (BT 433089) WERE HASTILY EVACUATED. COALS WERE STILL WARM BUT NO ONE FOUND IN AREA OR SEEN BY PATROL.
8. RESULTS OF ENCOUNTERS WITH THE ENEMY: NO CONTACT WITH THE VC WAS MADE BY THIS PATROL.
10. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS: EXCESS OF RICE IN HOUSE OCCUPIED BY 2 OLD LADIES IS SUSPICIOUS AND MIGHT BE A VC RICE CACHE, FURTHER CHECKING BY OTHER PATROLS OR PFS IS RECOMMENDED.

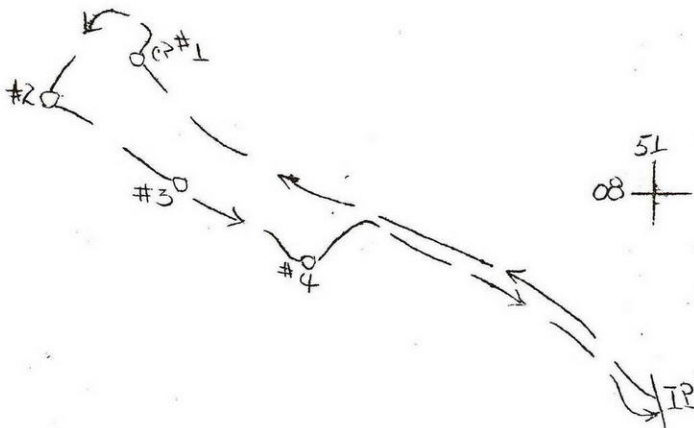
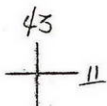

11. ADDITIONAL COMMENTS BY DEBRIEFER: VACANT HOUSES NEAR KNOB (BT 431089) INDICATE AN EFFICIENT WARNING SYSTEM IN OPERATION. PATROL DID NOT HEAR SIGNALS BEING PASSED. VC WHO FIRED ON TROOPS EARLIER IN THE MORNING MAY HAVE SOUNDED A GENERAL WARNING IN THE AREA TO ACCOUNT FOR VACANT HOMES. POSSIBLY THAT RICE MAY BE FOUND IN HOUSE AT (BT 443099), BUT IF VC OWNED IT, IT PROBABLY WILL BE MOVED IMMEDIATELY UPON DISCOVERY BY OUR FORCES.

1. In accordance with reference (a), the following report is submitted:
 - a. On 27 and 28 September 1965, pamphlets were distributed to the rifle companies with instructions for patrols to pass them out along their patrol routes for the Vietnamese people to read.
 - b. On 7 and 8 October 1965, Company "I" with attachments, accompanied by Popular Forces and interpreter, provided security for a Psychological Warfare Team to conduct lectures in the village of KHUONG THO (1). The team consisted of the LY TIN District Intelligence Chief and four of his agents. The Marines with the aid of intelligence personnel and Popular Force troops summoned the inhabitants from their hamlet and moved them to an assembly area. After the lectures, the inhabitants of the village began destroying local VC trenches and fighting holes. The people became very congenial with both Marines and PF Troops. A definite rapport was established between military and civilian. Limited medical assistance was provided by company corpsmen.
 - c. Following a successful operation in the LY TIN District that netted 12 VCS, by Marines from Company "I" and Popular Forces troops, the Hamlet Chief spoke to 53 villagers explaining the role of the U.S. Marine Corps and our purpose in present activities.
 - d. MEDCAP patrols from Company "M" along with medical assistance teams have treated over 1,000 persons in the AN TAN and LONG BINH Hamlets, during the last 20 days, promoting good will and providing medical assistance.
 - e. Intelligence reports from the LY TIN District Headquarters indicate an 81mm Mortar is buried somewhere in LONG BINH (BT 505070). Our intentions are to take an 81mm Mortar into the village, with a Psychological Warfare Team, and show it to the villagers, offering a reward for the uncovering of the 81mm Mortar buried in the Hamlet.
 - f. In upcoming plans and intentions a more active employment and increased coordination in this section will be formulated.

S-3 CHRONOLOGY

1. Significant Events

- a. On the evening of 7 October 1965 Company K made a night helicopter landing at (BT 435055) as a response to intelligence received. The lift was executed smoothly with the company receiving only sporadic sniper fire during touch-down from vicinity of KY LONG (1) village. See After Action Report #39.
- b. Again reacting to intelligence Company L was helilifted on 14 October 1965 to vicinity (BT 405055) to act as a striking force against 30(+) VC reported in area by a Recon Platoon Patrol. The company accounted for one VC killed, captured one 7.62mm Carbine and ammunition. Also uncovered was a cache of rice estimated at four and one half tons along with one ton of salt and 30 gallons of kerosene. The rice was recovered and redistributed to villagers in the CHU LAI area, the salt, grain and kerosene were destroyed.
- c. On 18 October 1965 Companies L and M were helilifted to a position twelve miles North of CHU LAI, as OPERATION TRIPLE PLAY commenced. The operation was supported by Artillery, Tanks, Ontos and Engineers. As a result of the operation 9 VC were killed, 6 VC captured, 20 VCS held, and two weapons captured. The only Marine casualties during the entire operation were 2 WIA's slightly wounded from a grenade thrown by a VC. See After Action Report #40.
- d. On 23 October 1965 Companies I and M participated in OPERATION TRIPLE THREAT. During the first part of the operation the Battalion Medical Officer, aided by Company Corpseman, administered medical aid to local inhabitants. After a search of the village of KHUONG NHON (AT 426093) the 4th Marines ordered a search of the Northern section of the 3/3 TAOR to check reported enemy movement within that area. The search netted no VC. See After Action Report #41.
- e. On 24 October 1965 Company M provided a blocking force along the SONG CAO River from coord (BT 415132) to (BT 435114) as part of 1st Battalion, 4th Marines OPERATION FIED PIPER, and also is providing security for Battery H, 12th Marines in conjunction with the same operation.
- f. Early on the morning 28 October 1965 the airfield at CHU LAI was attacked. Companies I and K engaged the fleeing VC in front of and behind their lines resulting in 3 VC killed, capturing 3 Thompson-Sub Machine Guns and 2 pouches containing a total of 5 grenades. Company K sustained two slightly wounded Marines from this action. The 81mm Mortar Platoon provided illumination throughout the night.

- g. On 30 October 1965 the battalion was placed on 100% alert, as a result of a reported attack on DA NANG. All companies and attachments were alerted. Company M was moved by C-130 aircraft to DA NANG for employment. A section of 81mm Mortars and 196 Recoilless Rifles accompanied the company.

1. Significant Events- Not applicable
2. Now Developements - New helicopter request procedures for company size and larger operations have been put into effect.
3. Problem Areas
 - a. It is almost impossible for this battalion to react quickly and effectively on intelligence due to the newly imposed helicopter request procedures.
 - b. The battalion TACP at the present time is almost out of operation due to a shortage in batteries for its radios. At the present time we have no batteries. The only operable piece of gear is the M-87 radio Jeep.
 - c. It is requested that helicopter crews handle logistic supplies, such as empty water cans, with greater care, instead of throwing them out of the helos.
 - d. Helicopter units seem to refrain from accepting a lift that will require proceeding to a landing zone under the hours of darkness so a unit can have troops lifted into a landing zone at first light. This type of lift is essential to capture VC units that harbor in a village at night and then move to the hills during the hours of daylight.
4. Contributions - UH-1E aircraft are very sueful in their spot/observer missions. The helicopters can direct a troop unit to the exact areas where VC have hidden. If this can't be done satifactorily over a radio the helo can take the unit commander up so he can see the terrain and show him where the enemy is. This has been done in this battalion and has been very successful, resulting in VC kills and captured.

MEDICAL AND DENTAL

A. Battalion Aid Station Chronological Data

1. Significant Events - Five (5) confirmed cases of malaria from the 2nd platoon of Kilo Company symptomatic between the 19th and the 23rd of October 1965. These men were apparently infected during a 3 day operation beginning 4 October 65 in the foothills at grid coordinates BT421065. All of these men had been taking the malaria prophylaxis weekly by roster

The use of mosquito repellent and the practice of keeping as much of the body covered as possible were emphasized again.

2. New Developments - Due to the increase of mosquitoes following the recent rainy spell a mosquito control program has been instituted which include, area spraying, water oiling and individual control instructions.

3. Problem Areas

a. Heads

- (1) Due to the prevalence of beach sand in the area, it has been necessary to support the dropping holes with 55 gallon drums in order to make the heads fly proof.

- (2) Material for framing-in heads is in short supply.

b. Supply

- (1) Medical - No Change

- (2) Lime - None presently available in the Chu Lai area.

- (3) Soap - During the last week of the month, soap for the galley was not available. Numerous individuals donated a portion of their personal box of detergent so that the galley would continue to operate.

4. Other contributions under the cognizance of the Battalion Surgeon: Medical Civil Affairs Program - 1,437 civilians were treated in the hamlets of An Tan and Long Binh.

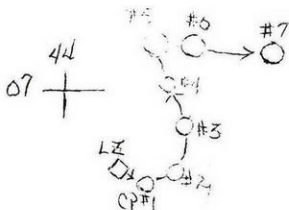

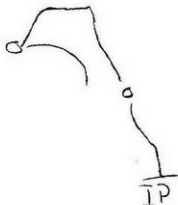

Highlights. - As a result of OPERATION TRIPLE PLAY the following was accomplished; 9 VC killed, 6 VC captured, 20 VC suspects held, 2 weapons captured (one French carbine and one Chicom carbine), 2 grenades (M-26) captured also Huey helicopters accounted for one definite VC kill and possibly several others. These choppers were extremely helpful in assisting the Battalion CO to control the search operation, and also in spotting VC in the rice paddies below them. On one occasion the Huey landed, picked up a rifle platoon commander, flew him over the rice paddy area where VC were spotted and returned the platoon commander to his platoon in order that he could lead his platoon through the area. Several VC were caught hiding in the rice paddies under water breathing through bamboo tubes as Marines were crossing the area. In one case, unaware that a Marine was only a few feet behind him, a VC raised up, pulled the pin from a grenade in preparation to throw it at a Marine in front of him, and caught a severe butt stroke in the back of his head. The VC fell backwards on to his own grenade and was killed instantly. One Vietnamese woman was wounded from an undetermined origin and was evacuated by helicopter to B-Med. The battalion (-) (Rein) searched through an odd mining activity and ridge line (BT 363133). The mine was approximately 70 feet deep, 15 feet in diameter and brick lined. There were no signs of any recent activity and no apparent military significance. At BT 367126 a large cave was blown by 140 lbs of demolitions, partially destroying it. The only Marine casualties during the entire operation were 2 WIA's slightly wounded from a grenade thrown by a VC. The VC was killed immediately. There were no indications of large VC unit activity in the area searched during OPERATION TRIPLE PLAY.

Company K and Company I engaged the fleeing Viet Cong in front of and behind their lines resulting in 3 VC killed, capturing 3 Thompson-Sub Machine Guns and 2 pouches containing a total of 5 grenades. Company K sustained 1 slightly wounded Marine from this action as a result of grenade fragments. The 81mm Mortar Platoon provided illumination throughout the night. At daybreak Company I commenced a search of the area from the airfield to highway #1 with Company M in a blocking position along the highway. At 0800 the Battalion was ordered to cordon the village of AN TAN as result of intelligence reports of an assassination team in that village. Nature of Action: Cordon and search

2. General: Company "I", during the hours of darkness, surrounded the hamlet of KHUONG THO (1). At first light, the company moved into the village with Popular Force troops and conducted a hamlet search, psychological warfare lectures and some medical assistance.

a. At 032400H, Company "I" proceeded from Hill 69 (BT 468068) and moved into a company assembly area vicinity (BT 446072) arriving at 040330H. From there the company dispatched recon teams to survey the objective area of KHUONG THO (1) (BT 453074). At 040530H, Company "I" moved from the assembly area to the objective area and encircled KHUONG THO (1); the company covered themselves in the trenches and fighting holes surrounding the hamlet. No persons entered or exited from the encirclement; The companies presence was unknown. The company remained around the village until the arrival by helicopter of the LY TIN District Intelligence Chief, four (4) of his agents, and a PF squad. Shortly thereafter, the Marines with the aid of intelligence personnel and Popular Force Troops summoned the inhabitants from their hamlet and moved them into an assembly area. The Vietnamese intelligence personnel conducted mass and individual interrogation, and psychological warfare lectures. The hamlet chief also participated in the lectures. Marines and Popular Force Troops with the aid of two (2) mine-detectors conducted a thorough search of the hamlet three (3) times. Nothing unusual was found. The interrogation revealed two (2) VCC and two (2) ARVN deserters. One of the VCC provided a list of names of other VC in the area. At 041030H a number of sporadic sniper rounds were fired by an estimated four (4) VC at the assembly area from vic (BT 448076). An element of the company with some PF's neutralized the sniper fire and quickly moved into the area from where the sniper fire came but could not find anyone. One of the VC captives showed the location of a cave with four (4) exits which were destroyed. After the sniper fire incident, the people of KHUONG THO (1) were allowed to return to the hamlet for noon chow, after which they began destroying local VC trenches and fighting holes. The people became very congenial with both Marines and PF troops. A definite rapport was established between the military and the civilian. Limited medical

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assistance was provided by the company corpsman. At 041300H the company departed KIUONG THO (1) and arrived at Hill 69 (BT 468068) at 041430H. One (1) M-16 mine was located and destroyed at coord (BT 451073).

3. Remarks

a. The use of skilled military personnel appear valuable in village search and psychological warfare. The use of tear gas would have aided materially in searching tunnels and large family bunkers.

2. Summary. In response to a reliable Vietnamese spot intelligence report, Co K conducted a quick-reaction night airborne strike into GS (BT 4305). The area was reported to hold two (2) companies of Viet Cong heavily armed with automatic weapons, mortars and recoilless rifles. A platoon patrol from CoM, 3d Bn, 3d Mar occupied a patrol base in GS (BT 4206), at the time. Company K was lifted by HMM 362 and landed in an unsecured landing zone under aircraft flare illumination amid sporadic small arms fire. After landing the company - passed a reported VC minefield and conducted intensive patrol operations throughout the objective area for the remainder of the night and the following day, when link - up was effected with the Co M patrol. No VC contact was made and no casualties were incurred.

3. Narrative Account

a. At 071800 3d Bn 3d Mar received an intelligence report from LX TIN District Headquarters that two VC companies were reported to be at (BT 429072) and (BT 424064). 1st platoon, Co M at this time occupied a patrol base nearby at (BT 426066). At 071820 the Battalion Commander decided to launch Co K into the objective area, and requested helicopter support through 4th Marines. At 1915 helicopters arrived at Company K loading zone and the lift commenced at 1920. The company was landed at (BT 43055), approximately 900 meters south of the requested LZ (BT 434064).

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Aircraft flares illuminated the LZ throughout the helilift and UH-1E and A4 aircraft were on station. During the helicopter movement approximately 6 rounds of SA fire were directed at helicopters approaching the LZ from KY LONG (1) (DT 436052). The lift was completed at 2000.

b. As the company began its ground movement to close with the reported VC units, information was received from the Battalion CP's as to the location of two minefields (DT 435056) and (DT 440055) to (DT 440060). These were bypassed without incident. The company moved through extremely heavy growth into GS (DT 4306) and (DT 4206), searching the area and establishing ambushes during the remainder of the night. Link-up with the Company M patrol was effected early the following morning at (DT 429065). All units continued to patrol the area until 1530 that afternoon, when Company K was helilifted back to its normal location near the airfield.

c. The search operation failed to detect evidence of the two reported VC companies. However, vegetation in this area is sufficiently dense to enable a sizeable VC force to disperse and escape detection.

4. Lessons Learned

a. Reaction capability. The most significant lesson derived from this operation is the knowledge that we do in fact possess in the CHU LAL Enclave the operational capability to launch a company size helicopter strike force within one hour, from a no-alert posture (the neither Company K nor MAG 36 were in any particular alert status at the outset). In this regard three factors are worth noting:

(1) The helicopters could have been airborne approximately 15 minutes earlier had an alert or warning request been passed to MAG 36 at the time the intelligence information was received at 3rd Battalion, 3rd Marines. Procedures for avoiding this type of time loss in the future have subsequently been developed by the units concerned.

(2) The time of day (1800) was probably the most disadvantageous time for rapid launching of this type of operation, from the helicopter unit's standpoint. Their rapid response is considered highly commendable.

(3) The time lapse between the receipt of the intelligence information (1800) and the decision by this command to request the launch (1920) was spent in estimating the situation. Considering the necessity for evaluation certain key factors -- i.e. the reliability of the intelligence source, the potential threat to the Company M patrol, the hazards of a night landing in an unsecured and heretofore unused LZ, and the degree of Company K's familiarity with the objective area as well as the need to analyze alternate course of action and formulate an operation plan, twenty minutes is probably not excessive for this type of situation.

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b. Coordination and Briefing. It is considered essential that the troop unit commander and the flight leader confer on details of the landing prior to launching an operation of this type. This can be effected at the loading zone, and requires that the flight leader join the troop leader on the ground. About five minutes should suffice for this coordination.

c. LZ Identification. Landing in the wrong LZ -- an undesirable situation in VC territory -- can best be avoided if the troop leader, who should know where he wants to go, is in direct communication with the flight leader at the time of let-down. Although in this case the troop leader was in the flight leader's aircraft and was manning the inter-com, he was unable to talk with the pilot due to other radio transmissions in progress. Procedures to prevent recurrence of this are under study.

d. LZ Marking at Night

(1) The landing zone used was continuously illuminated by aircraft flares, although there was a three-quarter full moon and visibility was excellent. It is believed that the flares were not essential to the landing, and served to degrade the element of surprise possible in this type of operation.

(2) Some flight elements of the helicopter unit landed a considerable distance (approximately 600 meters) from the lead element. This probably could have been avoided had better lighting equipment been available to the troops landed in the lead element. Flashlights were employed, but unsuccessfully. (The flares may have been a factor). A more powerful light is needed to mark the LZ for subsequent waves. The pocket strobe light issued as pilot survival equipment might prove to be satisfactory for this purpose, and will be investigated.

Place: Duc Do (GS BT 3715 and vicinity).

Casualties: 2 Marine WIA (slight), 9VC KIA (confirmed).

Nature of Action: Search and Destroy

2. Summary. 3d Battalion, 3d Marines conducted a two day search and destroy mission North of the Battalion TAOR in the vicinity of Duc Do. Two companies and a Battalion Command Group landed by helo in two LZ's South of Duc Do and searched Northward through the village complex, then reversed course and reswep the same area, spending the night on high ground South of Duc Do. During the first day there were eight VC killed, six VCC captured, and eighteen VCS captured without sustaining any friendly casualties. On the second day the Marines suffered two minor WIA's by VC grenade fragments while killing one VC. The operation developed several significant lessons described in paragraph 3 below.

3. Narrative Account

a. Company I at 181100H, the company was helolifted into LZ WHITE (BT 383143). By 181225H the entire company was lifted in; no enemy contact was encountered during the landing phase. As the company moved through the assigned zone of action, a pyramid of sticks indicating booby traps and punji pits was found. At 1235H, punji traps were found vicinity (BT 382145). Engineers destroyed the punji's with demolitions. In the same area of the punji's, a Vietnamese male was seen making an old man behind a hut. The Vietnamese was apprehended and identified as a VC by accompanying PF's and the interpreter. In the vicinity of (BT 377149) at 181315H, a pair of military boots were found and two VCs were seen running from the scene. The Marines attempted to halt the VC by shouts and warning shots. One VC kept running and was killed. The other VC was captured and identified as a VC by the PF's and interpreter. At 181345H, (BT 382156) a VC with a rifle attempted to run from the approaching company. The VC was killed, his weapon and ammo captured. Meanwhile, UH - 1E helicopters were providing valuable air surveillance and firing on VC to the front and flank of the company. At 181400H, the company found the body of a dead VC killed by the supporting UH - 1E's. At 181445H, (BT 375155) two punji traps were found.

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Also, in the area of the punji traps, some military clothing was found. At 181500H, twelve VCS were found at (BT 375158). At the same time, 3VC were found hiding in a hole vicinity (BT 376160). At 181530H a VC armed with a machete was killed as he charged a Marine vicinity (BT 374157). At 181615H the company reached the LOA and began searching back towards LZ Red. At the LZ, all prisoners were tagged and helolifted out. The company moved into night defensive position on the hill mass at (BT 372137). A boobytrapped rifle grenade was found at (BT 372127). The night defense was conducted without incident. At 190630H, the booby-trapped rifle grenade was destroyed by Engineers. At (BT 366127), a large cave was discovered. The Engineers attempted to destroy the cave by demolitions; the effort only enlarged the mouth of the cave. At 191400H, two VC were spotted at (BT 377122). The VC were taken under fire and one was wounded. As the Marines followed the wounded man's trail of blood, the wounded VC exposed himself and threw a grenade which killed the VC, slightly wounded the two Marines who were evacuated shortly thereafter. From this incident, one rifle (M16-36) and four carbine magazines were captured. The company secured the LZ (BT 378122) for retraction back to the battalion. Company L was retracted at 191715H.

b. Company M - At 181100H Company M (less one platoon) was helolifted into LZ Red (BT 372142). The other platoon was held airborne in a nearby orbit to be landed on call at LZ Red or at an LZ to be designated, in order to cut off VC escape. This strike force was landed at LZ Red at 181200H. At 181430H, two VCS were captured at (BT 371153). At 181430H, the company found five more VCS. At 181515H, a young man and girl were found hiding in the paddies under water at (BT 368154). The young man attempted to escape and was killed. A short distance away another VC was found hiding in a hole. At 181600H a knapsack and VC flag were found on a hillock at (BT 367157). Also in this vicinity, a VC attempted to throw a grenade at the Marines who had passed his hiding position. A Marine immediately behind the VC gave him a butt stroke with his rifle before the grenade could be thrown. The VC was killed by his own grenade. At (BT 365156) another VCS was apprehended. Shortly afterwards a UH-1E radioed the company that it had spotted four VCS in the bush. The 1st platoon Commander was picked up and flown to the spot, the platoon moved to the point killing one VC at (BT 360166) and another at (BT 365158) captured one VCS, found a wounded woman VCS (later evacuated) and killed one VC in the same vicinity. At 181800H, the company moved into night defensive positions on the hill mass at (BT 372137). The night defense was conducted without incident. At 190900H, (BT 363133), the company found a tall smoke stack and mine shaft 12' and 70' deep. Another cave, appearing to be recently inhabited, was found at (BT 362134). The cave was 25 to 30 meters in length with a solid rock interior. Demolitions on hand were insufficient to destroy it. A brick furnace at (BT 562161) was blown since it could have been used as a bunker to cover fields of fire in the area. The company moved to an LZ at (BT 378123) and was retracted at 191500H.

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4. Lessons Learned - Operation TRIPLE PLAY uncovered three lessons regarding air support operations which, because of their uniquely successful outcome, are considered to be of more than routine significance.

a. Use of a Heliborne Reserve - The plans for the operation included holding out one rifle platoon aboard helicopters in a nearby aerial orbit, to be landed on order of the Bn CO in one of three LZ's. The purpose of this was to have a ready mobile strike force, at hand in the objective area, capable of being landed on a few minutes notice to cut-off escaping VC or to otherwise exploit the initial ground advance. From the standpoint of helicopter availability, fuel consumption, and control, this scheme worked well. The absence of VC contact in the initial phase of the search made it unnecessary to employ this heliborne reserve as a cut-off force, and it was reverted to company control after approximately fifteen of holding in orbit. The significant thing is that this force could have been landed on call, in a different LZ (prepped as required by the situation) and could have this provided a degree of tactical flexibility not otherwise possible. It is planned to employ such a force in future operations.

b. Use of Command Helicopter - The Troop Unit Commander (Bn CO) was lifted in the same helo (UH-1E) with the TAC and the arty MO for the entire period of the helolift. This provided a measure of close coordination and instant control that has never before achieved in the experience of the undersized in Vietnam. The direct effects of this arrangement, which was so advantageous that it should be made SOP, were as follows:

(1) The LZ prop was directly observed, controlled and coordinated with the troop lift by the key personnel involved in this part of the operation. Had it been necessary to substitute arty for the fixed wing air prop, this could have been done quickly and safely.

(2) Landing the troops in the correct LZ's was insured, since the Bn CO pointed them out and the TAC marked them with smoke rockets.

(3) Information of the situation in the LZ's was immediately available to the people who needed it most: The Bn CO and the TAC.

(4) Targets for air strike were identified, coordinated and strikes launched in the minimum possible time, with maximum control.

c. Use of UH-1E - The UH-1E gunships which remained on station throughout D-Day were instrumental in location, fixing and assisting in the killing and capturing of VC who were fleeing or hiding in the rice paddies. Ground-to-air communications were excellent, and as noted in the body of this report, the support rendered by the UH-1E's was in every respect outstanding. The normal employment of this aircraft in this role would undoubtedly enhance ground search and destroy operations more than any other single feature now lacking. It may be noted that 1st M&W policy, as understood here, precludes such a role for the armed UH-1E. This is, in my opinion, a great mistake and is directly responsible for countless missed opportunities to kill VC.

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This policy should be changed. The UH-1E is an ideal CAS weapon for this war. The fixed-wing high performance attack or fighter aircraft is virtually useless as a CAS weapon in this war with the sole exception of the Operation STARLIGHT type of situation. A 4 aircraft would have served no useful purpose on operation TRIPLE PLAY, where as the UH-1E was responsible in considerable measure for the success of the operation.

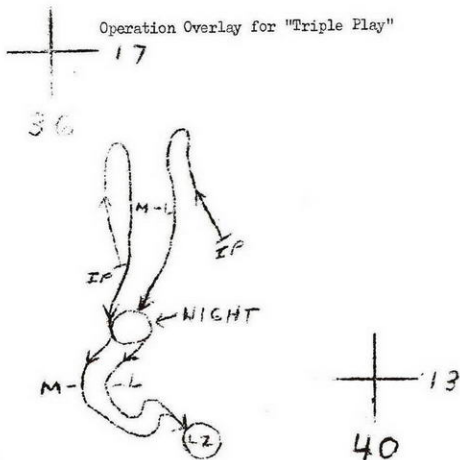

Nature of Action: Cordon and Search

Casualties: 1 MIA, 1 Non-Battle injury

2. Summary. The 3d Bn 3d Marines conducted a two-company cordon and search operation of KHUONG NHON village (BT 426093). During the operation, the Battalion Surgeon, aided by Company Corpsman, administered medical aid to the local inhabitants of the village. After a successful search of the village the Fourth Marine Regiment, acting on intelligence, ordered the 3d Battalion, 3d Marines to proceed into the Northern sector of the 3/3 TAOR to search for reported enemy movement within that area. The second search netted no VC.

a. Company I. At 222330H, the company commenced movement to the objective area. By 230615H, the company was in the assigned cordon position around KHUONG NHON village. At 230940H, eight VC with weapons were sighted in the vicinity of (BT 420094) the enemy were immediately taken under fire and one of the VC was observed to be hit. However, due to the depth of a river between the Marines and the VC, the VC were able to escape. At 231100H, the company moved to search an assigned area in the Northern section of the 3/3 TAOR. The villages of KHUONG PHU (BT 445115) and KHUONG DAI (2) (BT 452112) were searched without any discovery of VC activity. The company completed its movement by moving to National Route #1 and was retracted at 231630H.

b. Company M. At 230530H the company moved by truck to a dismount point (BT 441099) arriving at 230630H. At 230645H, as the company moved towards the objective area, small arms fire was received at (BT 433098). One Marine MIA resulted from the incident. By 230730H, the company was in its assigned cordon position and the village was being searched. At 230815H, a VC pack was found at (BT 427096). At (BT 429093) an ammo box with two clips M-1 rounds and assorted brass was found. At (BT 426095) three small canvas packs, communications wire, and some M 79 empty brass was found in the bottom of a rice basket. Two ID cards hidden under a mat were found in a hut in the same area. At 230915H, the company received small arms fire from (BT 427097). The company returned fire and moved to the area but could find nothing.

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One Marine received a minor hand wound from pottery fragments caused by a VC bullet hitting an urn. At 231100H, the company moved to search an assigned area in the Northern sector of the 3/3 TAOR. By 231400H, the search was completed and the company was in the loading point waiting for trucks. At 231800H, the company was retracted leaving one platoon in the area for further operations.

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1. CHARACTERISTICS OF THE AREA OF OPERATION.

The area of operations is that area bounded by the SONG TRAU on the Northeast, a line running Southeast from (BT 420090) to (BT 428084) and thence Northeast through (BT 448090) to the SONG BEN VAN. This area encompasses a large sandy area where the soil is largely calcareous sand. This sandy area extends from approximately 500 meters inland from the railroad line out to the beach line. The regular crystalline nature of this sand and the relatively shallow water table permits some pools to remain after a rain shower for considerable periods. This sandy area provides almost no cover from air observation but the duning effect provide concealment from local ground observation and limited cover from flat trajectory fire. The area east of the highway and railroad is the same sandy soil but is intensely cultivated with houses, surrounded almost unnaturally by banana trees, fruits and ferns. Paddy fields are found scattered throughout the area and some dry crops notably sweet potatoes and beans grown on raised hills within the fields. These raised rows may be 18 inches above the base level of the field and the interstices would give cover and concealment for prone persons from ground observation and cross fire. A second distinct Zone commences at the end of the sandy zone and extends inland to the base of the ridge containing hill 22. This area is almost entirely devoted to cultivation and houses. Rice is the principal crop grown. Vegetable plots, trees and shrubs are found on the raised area where the houses are located. Paddies are mostly flooded from several inches to approximately one foot. Soil in the paddy is brown mud and even the drained paddies are too soft to support wheeled traffic. The third zone is composed of the elevated ridgeline from (BT 420090) to (BT 239088). This zone is largely brush covered with some small trees, slopes are gentle and ridge is not very high but is the first high ground inland from highway in the area of operations. Brush provides only slight hindrance to foot troops and would be passable to tracked vehicles. Soil in this area is an orange clay. Housing varies considerably in the two areas between the area North of the highway and South of the highway. South of the highway the hamlets set on land raised above the paddy level. These raised "islands" in the paddy fields are the site of houses surrounded by trees and shrubs and small garden plots, but in close proximity to one another. North of the highway, houses are individually located in the fields worked by the people.

Drainage in the area of operation is generally Northwestward into Northeast flowing SONG TRAU. The main tributary stream bisecting the area of operations, at this season, is a moderately fast flowing stream about eight to ten feet wide, fordable in most places but with pot holes up to nine or ten feet deep, which could be dangerous since it is extremely difficult to detect these deep places from the bank. The banks of this stream are steep and, along the West bank in particular, aided by earth constructed dikes. Trees and bushes line most of the stream banks. Water is discolored.

The SONG TRAU is, at (BT 422095), about fifty feet wide with vertical banks. Water depth is about six to eight feet (see bottom contour profile). The current is fairly strong so that above chest deep it is difficult to stand and for fording presents extreme hazard to nonswimmers. Fording of

foot troops at this point could be accomplished only with difficulty at (BT 431100) the SONG TRAU is 20 meters wide and approximately six feet deep. It is fordable with difficulty. Enemy interference prevented further exploration for fording sites. Vehicle fording would not be practical due to the vertical banks approximately five or six feet high. The bottom is mud and along both banks were submerged bushes act as an abatis when fording the SONG TRAU.

No roads cross the area except the meter gauge railroad and highway 1. Highway 1 is an asphalt all-weather road approximately four meters wide. It is capable of carrying almost unlimited wheeled traffic but heavy tracked vehicles could damage the asphalt surface. Off the main roads, travel is cross country or along foot paths. No roads capable of carrying four wheeled traffic exist. Travel across paddy lands is along the paddy separators raised above paddy level one to two feet and varying from eight inches to two feet wide.

Farming provides virtually the only source of livelihood in this area. Most farming is based on rice growing with farmers living in the hamlets and traveling to the fields surrounding the hamlets. Many of the farmers apparently own water buffalo or oxen which are customarily penned at the edge of the hamlet whenever possible.

2. ENEMY SITUATION

The composition of enemy forces in the area of operations appears to have been mainly guerrillas armed only with small arms. All fire received in objective area was assessed as carbine fire and VC observed were reportedly carrying carbines, however 2 clips of M-1 ammunition were found in the area.

Probably the VC were alerted by warning shots fired as the company coming up highway 1 began to debark from trucks. This permitted the majority of the VC to leave the area or seek cover, safe from Marine search teams. Possibly, as reported by some civilian in the area, the VC evaded the Company "I" cordon and the Company "M" cordon before the companies joined. The first fire fight and the first Marine WIA occurred on the right flank of Company "M" (BT 433098) and the VC who opened fire escaped to the right of the advancing Marines.

VC activity in the area seemed to be devoted to preparation of fighting holes along side most trails and hedgerows. Most of the hedgerows were tunneled permitting rapid unseen movement. Within the portion of the hamlet at (BT 428093) a section of the trail had dirt dumped on it about 2½ feet deep, six feet wide and 50 feet long. Despite a thorough search, the source of the dirt could not be found. It appeared to have been dumped no more than two weeks prior to the operation. Villagers said the VC made them dig fighting holes along side the trails but made no mention of caves and denied knowledge of any. The villagers Southwest of the highway refused to answer many questions about the VC saying the VC would return and kill them. The villagers did say that there were some VC in the area in the morning. One villager said there were 3 armed with weapons similar to the carbine carried by the PFS. Another said that the day before or two days previously (unable to determine exactly due to an interpreter problem) there were 20 VC in the hamlet. Apparently this same VC group was referred to by a third Viet Namease as a VC platoon. Local inhabitants stated nervously that the VC

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fled "into the hills", "to the southeast" and "across the river" (SONG TRAU). All agreed they fled when the Marines approached. There were very few Vietnamese civilians in the area. Less than 20% of the normal population remained in the area.

The situation northeast of the highway was different in many respects. The villagers were friendly and freely answered questions. They stated the VC never come in the area because Marines and PFs patrolled the area every 3 or 4 days. The villagers claimed the VC did not collect taxes or assess rice donations from them. No evidence of punji pits or fighting holes were found in this area. They said that if the VC come to the school house at (BT 441099) they come from KHUONG HONG or KHUONG NHON (1) or further up highway 1. The people of the hamlet were not affected by them.

These villagers could furnish some food resources for the VC but neither appeared to be particularly rich areas. The few men found had no apparent special skills and were identified by their I.D. and the PFs as farmers so that no special skills of value to the VC were represented.

The VC did not appear to be able to communicate by any means but visual or sound signals and over a period of time this weakness might be exploitable. The VC apparently did not bother to booby trap this area. This oversight may have been due to lack of apprehension of Marine operations in the area or lack of booby trapping material. Since no punji traps were encountered, the former supposition would seem valid. The area east of the highway is not subject to VC operation.

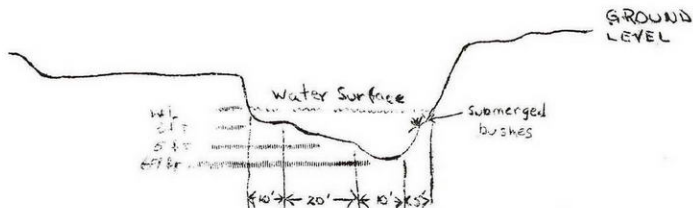

2. MISSION At L-hour on D-day 3d Bn, 3d Marines lands two companies and two PF platoons by helicopter in LZ Red, White and Blue. On D+1 conduct search and destroy operation; return to battalion area on order.

3. EXECUTION

a. Concept of Operations. Land one company (-) and one PF platoon in LZ Red, one company (-) and one PF platoon in LZ White, and one platoon (✓) lands in LZ Blue and establishes blocking position vicinity (BT377165). One platoon (✓) remains in helicopters in flight as a Mobile Striking Force and lands on order in assigned zone. Two companies and two PF platoons conduct search and destroy operation moving from South to North in assigned zones until blocking position is reached. On order two companies resweep from North to South to vicinity grid square (BT3713). On D+1 prior to first light two companies move into cordon positions around XUAN NGOC (1) and XUAN NGOC (2) in grid squares (BT3912) and (BT3911). At first light the two hamlets will be searched for VC and/or VC weapons.

bb. Company L

(1) At L-hour on D-day land one platoon (✓) in LZ Blue.

(2) Land two platoons LZ White.

1. SUMMARY OF ENEMY SITUATION. Viet Cong activity in the objective area has not previously been subject to effective intervention by U.S. Forces. The VC presumably has been able to propagandize and organize the civilian population. Some enemy efforts to prepare defensive positions have been detected such as trenches and fighting holes. It must be assumed that the VC has mined the area in which our forces will operate.

- (1) Aerial Reconnaissance. One request has been submitted to ADC and 4th Marines for aerial photos. 4th Marines to furnish vertical coverage of objective area. ADC will provide handheld photos of landing zones, hamlets and high ground in Grid Square (BT 3815).
- c. Coordinating Instructions. All units will report any information received concerning VC activities, units, weapons, or intentions in objective area.

4. MEASURES FOR HANDLING PRISONERS, CAPTURED DOCUMENTS AND CAPTURED MATERIAL.

- a. Prisoners. VC and VCS will be handled in accordance with reference (b). Prisoners will be treated humanely. They will be bound, blindfolded and tagged by the capturing unit to show Date-Time-Group of capture, place of capture by coordinates, circumstances of capture in sufficient detail to assist interrogators, and the identification of the capturing unit. Documents taken from VC or VCS will be tagged so they may be related to the person from whom taken and evacuated with the individual. Whenever practical, a Marine who participated in the capture of a person will be assigned as guard until delivered to the collection point. Walking wounded may be used for guards.
- b. Captured Documents. Captured documents will be tagged to indicate Date-Time-Group of capture, place of capture, circumstances of capture and identification of capturing unit. Documents should be forwarded to Battalion S-2 by fastest secure means.
- c. Captured Materiel. All captured war materiel becomes the property of the United States. Personal property, unless used to wage war or assist the enemy, is not to be seized. All property and materiel captured will be tagged with the same information as documents and forwarded to Battalion S-2. Items suitable for retention as trophies must be so indicated on the tag along with the name of the capturing individual. In this regard, weapons manufactured in the U.S. and weapons that violate federal or state firearms regulations may not be retained as trophies.
- (1) Enemy automatic weapons, weapons of unusual design or employment, anti-tank weapons and new or unique mines and grenades shall be forwarded to the Battalion S-2 as expeditiously as possible.


5. MAPS AND PHOTOGRAPHS

- a. The standard map for this operation is AMS VIETNAM 1:50,000, Series L701, Sheets 6757 III (TRI BINH) and 6757 IV (PHU NAM).

6. REPORTS AND DISTRIBUTION

- a. Spot Reports. Immediate report will be made of enemy contacts, battle casualties on either side, enemy sightings, or capture of enemy personnel, significant documents or significant material. All spot reports will include Date-Time-Group of incident, location by coordinates, and information in accordance with "SALUTE" format. Whenever possible, mines and booby traps will be diagrammed before destruction with all important dimensions noted. Mines or booby traps not intentionally detonated should be diagrammed as much as possible and fragments collected to assist in identifying the device. All details of enemy activity that inflicts casualties should be noted.
- b. Incoming Intelligence. Dissemination of intelligence to units will be made by radio or messenger depending on the situation.

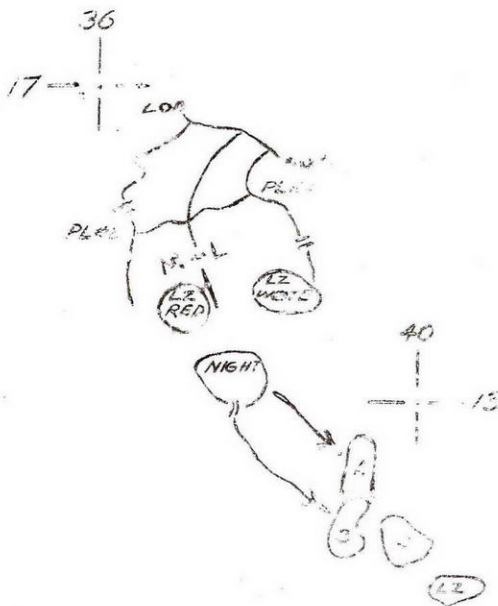


