

- e. R&R. Quotas were received from th Marine Regt. All quotas were filled.

#### 8. Chaplain Support, Religious Services, Schedules.

- a. During the month of Dec the Battalion Chaplain conducted 9 Sunday services with an attendance of 412 persons. In addition 6 weekday and special services were held with an attendance of 555 persons.
- b. During the month the Chaplain received and distributed Christmas presents to all members of the Battalion. He also arranged to have Christmas music played in the mess area.
- c. The Battalion Chaplain schedules divine services for all companies and the Battalion C. P. There is not an established schedule but services are scheduled based on operational commitment.
- 9. Civil Affairs, Military Government; Community Relations, Results of Med Cap Progress, Supplies Distributed, Projects Completed and in Progress.
- a. During the month of December this Command treated 3,700 persons in the hamlets of An Trach (1) (AT972662). In Chau (4) (AT950667) & Cam Hoa (2) (AT975701). The greatest number of persons teing treated daily occurred in An Trach (1) where at least 80 persons were treated.
- b. In the handet of An Trach a hamlet school was established for the children. It's continuance depends upon the presence of the Political Action Team working in the area. Catholic mass was said for the people in the hamlet church by a priest four times and on Christmas Day by the founder of the Parish a Vietnamese priest. On Christmas Eve a party was held for the children and 250 pounds of candy and toys were distributed.
- c. A roof was placed upon a bombed-out building to act as a dispensary by the people and a walkway was built through the mud to the dispensary.
- d. Ten persons were evacuated from the hamlets of An Trach and La Chau during this month.
  - e, 100 pounds of clothing were distributed throughout the TACR.
- f. The reaction of the people in the hamlets where a Med. Cap program has been established shows a change from one of mistrust and fear to one of confidence and friendship toward the Marines.

#### S-2 CHRONOLOGY

- 1. SIGNIFICART EVENTS. Operation "HARVEST MOON".
- 2. NEW DEVELOPMENTS. There were no significant new developments during the reporting period.
- 3. PROBLEM AREAS. At the present time there are 3 interpreters assigned to this Battalica. The shortage of interpreters has made collection of information from indigenous personnel, functioning of the civil affairs program, and liaison with local Vietnamese forces difficult. It is felt that 9 interpreters is a minimum required by an infantry battalion, with the ideal being sufficient interpreters to allow assignment of one per infantry platoon with 3 additional at the Battalion C.P. for use by the Command Group and G.2 during field operations, the Battalion Aid Station, Chaplain, and Civil Affairs Officer in the Battalion People to People program.
- 4. WEATHER. Weather in the Battalion MACE was moderate during the reporting period, and did not appreciably influence any of the activities of this unit. A total of 6.2 inches of rain was recorded during the month of December. During Operation "HARVEST MOON" the Battalion encountered several heavy rains which effected our nir sepability for close air support, resupply and troop lifts.

#### 5. INTELLIGENCE SUMMERY

- a. VC activity during the month of December increased considerably over the month of Movember. A true comparison cannot be made since the battalien, during the month of November, spent considerable time moving from CHU LAI to DA NANG, and did not begin operations in the present TAOR until December.
- b. VC activity in the Battalian TAOR during the reporting period consisted of isolated sniper and small arms incidents by individuals or small groups, mine and booby trap incidents, and attempted ambushes. During Operation "HARVEST MOON", the battalian encountered a large, and well armed VC force as indicated in appendices (2) and (3).
- c. There were 41 VC initiated incidents in the Battalian TAOR during December, excluding the period O81200H to 181700H during which Operation "HARVEST MOON" was in progress. During this period (O81200H to 181700H), the Battalian TAOR was under operational control of the 2nd Battalian, 9th Marines. These 41 incidents consisted of:
  - (1) 36 incidents of small arms fire
  - (2) 2 ambushes
  - (3) 3 booby trap and mine incidents

- 6. TARGET INFORMATION. No significant targets were reported during December.
- 7. DAILY INTELLIGENCE SUMMARIES. Attached as Appendix (1) (original only).
- 8. SPECIAL INTELLIGENCE REPORTS. Attached as Appendices (2) and (3) (original only).
- 9. A. O. REPORTS. Mething significant reported by cerial observers.

#### 10. PRISONER REPORT .

- a. There wase 7 VCS apprehended in the Dattelion TAOR during the reporting period. All suspects were execuated to ITT for investigation.
- b. There were 79 VCS approhended and execuated during Operation "HARVEST MON".

#### 11. ENEMY CASUALTICA

- a. There were 9 VC KIA (body count) in the Battalien TAOR during December.
- b. There were 101 VC KIA during Operation "MARVEST MOON", including VC killed by air strikes and artillery fire.

#### 12. CAPTURED EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES

- a. There were 2 pounds of TNT (US), 4 M-26 grenades, 1 first aid packet, and 1 cartridge belt captured in the Battalian TAGR.
- b. See Appendix (2), paragraph 1. a. (6) for equipment and supplies captured during Operation "HARVEST MOCK".

During the month of December, both (2) AN/TPS-21's assigned to the Battalion were unserviceable and at FISG, DA NANG for repair.

During the reporting period, Company "M" was positioned around MSP#1, and did not employ any SID-150's assigned to this Battalion.

#### S-3 CHRONOLOGY

#### 1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS.

l Dec. Co I was helilifted from (AT 975707) at 011130H to L 3/9 CP (AT 968663). The lift was completed at 011300H with Co I coming under OPCON of 3/9 to provide security for the Pacification Cadre in the vicinity of (AT 963677), (AT 970695) and (AT 995670).

2 Dac. Oc K was helilifted from (4T 975707) at 020900H to A 1/1 CP (AT 954567). The lift was completed at C21105H with Co K coming under OPCON of 1/1.

3 Dec. 3d Establion, 3d Marines assumed responsibility for assigned sector of the 2000 at 031500H, relieving 1/1 and 3/9 units. At 032100H a time test ambush departed to K CP (AT 953656). Enroute to ambush site tw. VC were encountered. Fire was exchanged with both VC being billed.

4 Dec. At 041830H approximately 25 s/a rounds were fired into Co I's CP (AT 972662). Fire was returned and 3 young males were observed running into a canefield at (AT 923663). Three fire team patrols were immediately sent to investigate with negative results.

5 Dec. At 051057H a platoon patrol discovered a VC rice cache of from 2 to 4 humired pounds at (AT 969650). As the rice was being recovered a heavy volume of s/a rounds and automatic fire was received from an estimated 20 VC, resulting in one USMC WIA. Fire including old mortar fire was returned. At 051145H artillery was on target with good effect, stopping all VC fire. There were no traces of VC doad and no further VC activity. At 051325H lst Plat Co I was heldlifted from (AT 965660) to a LZ at (AT 976649) to reinforce the 3d platoon in destroying VC fortifications. At 050215 a Co K IP at (AT 950669) received 2 s/a rounds. Fire was returned with negative results. At 052330H the Bn CP (AT 975702) received one round of s/a fire. No casualties.

6 Dec. A Co I patrol destroyed an extensive VC tunnel network at (AT 969645). At 060935H while encoute to the Co I CP the patrol was taken under heavy s/a and automatic weapons fire from (AT 965650) resulting in one USMC WIA med even. The patrol reacted with maneuver, s/a, 60mm and 81mm mortar fire. Two VC were located at (AT 965650) and killed by Marine fire. At 060940H four VC were observed firing from the edge of a cans field (AT 968653). A 60mm mortar concentration resulted in four VC killed.

7 Dec. At 071305H a Co I squad ambush engaged 7 VC killing two.
Two other VC were seen to be hit. There were pessibly more wounded.
The squad moved forward to investigate the immediate area, and found a large amount of blood and a bloody trail into dense vegetation. Further investigation proved negative.

B Dec. The Battalion Command Group (4) and Co L (Rein) came under OPCON TASK FORCE DELTA at OB1200H. Co's I, K, and M reverted to OPCON 2/9 at the same time. At OB1225H three rounds s/a fire were directed at hele's making resupply runs at Co I's position. At OB1825H vicinity (at 973663) a Co I patrol was fired on by two VC. Fire was returned and contact broken. One Marine WIA but not evacuated. At OB1910H Co I CP received one s/a rend. Fire returned with negative results. At OB2024H Co I patrol at ('T 970665) received ten rounds of a/w fire from (AT 970665). One M-79 fired by Marines. At OB2030H 12-15 rounds from two a/w weapons fired into K Co CF (AT 954667) from an undetermined position.

9 Dec. The Mactalian Command Group (A) and to L (Rain) as part of TASK FORCE FOR PA departed 090500H by motor merch for the site of the LSA vicinity (BY A55455). Full information on Operation HATMEST MOUN can be found in After Action Report #62.

10 Dec. At 171305H a returning Co K patrol detonated a grenade booky trap at (AT 955664), wounding three Marines who were med evacuated. The area was searched for any other booky traps with negative results. At 102000H Co K CP (AT 954666) received 10/20 s/a rounds from (AT 955665). Fire was returned with urknown results.

fire vicinity (Af 972660). Fire returned. At 111100H a Co I plateon petrol was fired on at (AT 957657) receiving 75-100 s/a rounds. Fire was returned and squad searched area with negative results. One Marine was WIA and required evacuation at 111145H. At 112000H a Co I ambuse at (AT 971658) saw two men. Fired on them and illuminated the area with negative results. At 112300H a Co I LF at (AT 973661) was approached by two men. The Marines threw granades and fired or them with negative results.

12 Dec. At 122210H Co I CP (AT 972662) received two s/a rounds from a Scuthwest direction. Returned fire and illuminated area with negative results.

13 Dec. No Contact.

14 Dec. At 141955H Co I CP received a/w and s/a fire from vicinity (AT 961676). No casualties. At 142115H Co K CP (AT 954667) received s/a fire and one grenade from Southwest. Six rounds of s/a fire returned. VC casualties unknown.

15 Dec. At 150100H Co I CP received 10 rounds of s/a from vicinity (AT 971659) with 10-15 s/a rounds fired in return with negative results. At 151025H a squad patrol from Co K was fired on by approximately five VC (AT 953648).VC broke contact. At 151203H the same squad patrol, attempting to maintain contact, received heavy fire from vicinity (AT 948653), resulting in three USMC WIA. At 151215H 2d Plat Co K transported by Otters left to reinforce patrol arriving at 151240H.

At 151300H artillery fired 46 rounds of 105mm. Lt 151305H VC ceased fire and broke contact. The 2d platoon moved North to establish a blocking force from (AT 9566) to (AT 9666). Ist Plat Co K helilifted at 151435H to vicinity (AT 939641) to sweep East and North along SONG YEN with one platoon Co I blocking vicinity (AT 956645).

16 Dec. On 16 November two Dog Teens were attached to Co I and were being used on patrols. Dempness in area of operations appears to hinder their effectiveness. At 161215H a Co K platoon patrol received s/a fire vicinity (AT 952633). One Marine WIA med evac. Returned fire. Results unknown. At 161430H the patrol found two bear traps vicinity (AT 949634).

17 Dec. A Co I sqd patrol with two Dog Teams attached received three rds s/a fire at 171110H vicinity (AT 965653). No casualties. Fire was returned. Results unknown.

18 Dec. At 181000H a patrol from Co K vicinity (AT 952651) received 10 rounds s/a fire from East of river, LE SON (4) (AT 958654). Returned fire. One Marine WIL med evac. At 181130H Co K patrol received s/a fire from vicinity (LT 953648). Returned fire with s/a and M-79. At 181700H Command Group returned to CP and CHUTED from Task Force Delta. At 181940H Co I CT received one hand granade with negative results.

19 Dec. No contact.

20 Dec. At 201450H a squad patrol from Co I vicinity (AT 974655)
received 10 rounds s/a fire. Fire was returned with negative results.
At 200805 a platoen petrol from Co K detonated booky trapped north round on side of trail at (AT 955664), resulting in one Marine KIA and one WIA. At 202055H a squad patrol from Co K vicinity (AT 955664) while taking cover from illumination by flare ship received s/a fire from vicinity (AT 955661). Returned fire with unknown results. One Marine WIA.

21 Dec. At 211945H Co I CP (AT 972662) received 30 rounds a/w and s/a fire vicinity (AT 972659). Returned fire, illuminated area and searched with no results. At 211743H a squad from Co L at river block (IT 972699) received s/a fire from vicinity (AT 979693). One mortar round landed in river junction. Vietnamese dressed in white with rifle in hand on opposite side of river was shot and presumed killed.

22 Dec. At 221935H Co I River Block (AT 963660) received 125 s/a fire from vicinity (AT 963658). Returned fire and illuminated area with negative results.

23 Dec. Lt 231310H Co I River Block (AT 963660) received two rounds s/a fire. Fire returned. Une Marine WIA and evacuated. At 231425H Co L relieved Co K of Western portion of TAUR.

24 Dec. At 241115H vicinity (AT 963667) a Co I Marine helping a Vietnamese dig a well hit a buried M-79 round one foot under the ground and was wounded. At 241730H Co K in conjunction with ARVN forces assumed responsibility of the Western portions of the Pacification Area. At 241906H Co I CT (AT 973663) received two rounds s/a fire from vicinity (AT 973660). At 242130H, SID 150's picked up movement vicinity (AT 964675). Hand illumination thrown and three s/a rounds received. Returned fire and a search was conducted with negative results.

25 Dec. At 251145H Co I River Block (AT 963660) received 40 rounds s/a fire from vicinity (AT 963658) from an estimated four VC. Three rounds of Slam morter were delivered and the area was searched with negative results. At 251400H Co I River Block called for two morter rounds on VC sniper positions. Co L on other side of river saw one VC get hit and another carry off the body. At 251653H Co L River Block (AT 963660) received 12 s/a rounds vicinity (AT 960655). Returned two M-79 rounds with unknown results.

26 Dec. At 261145H Co I River Block (AT 962663) received 50 rounds s/a fire from vicinity (AT 964661). Returned fire with s/a and 81mm with negative results. At 260053H Co L (AT 954667) received one s/a round. At 260950H a Co L squad security patrol received 50-100 rounds s/a fire from two a/w and 10 VC (AT 952650). One Marine WIA and was med evac. Fired four 81mm morter rounds and another squad searched area with negative results. At 262000H 3d Platoon Co L (AT 962660) received four rounds s/a fire from (AT 959657). Two M-79 rounds were returned with negative results. At 262230H a Co M squad vic (AT 973660) ambushed five VC killing two VO. The ambush then neved and were taken under fire by six VC vic (AT 973660) resulting in one USMC WIA. Fire was returned and the VC broke contact.

27. Dec. At 270430H Co K reinforced with 3d Flat Co I moved from (AT 989677) to blocking resition vicinity (T 971614) to (AT 967638) arriving at 270730H. They received six rounds s/a fire from (AT 963632) Fire returned. At 271040H fired two rounds at undetermined number of VC (AT 975613). Observed one VC killed. At 271629H Co. L provided film illumination and HE/W fire mission for RF squad at DUCNG IAM (1) vicinity (AT 946692) which was attacked by VC.

20 Dec. At 201232H Co F vicinity LE SON (3) (AT 979649) received 37 rds s/a fire from vicinity THAI C M (1) (AT 975645). Fire returned and contact broken. No casualties.

29 Dec. At 290000H the 2d Flat Co M vicinity (AT 977647) received s/a fire from five VC with carbines. One USMC WIA mod evacuated. At 290013H Let Flat Co M vicinity (AT 969646) received s/a fire from eight VC with carbines. Following these two contacts, an air strike was called on (AT 966650) (AT 977653), (AT 973650), (AT 962641) and (AT 973642). Air was controlled by AC who sighted VC moving through came fields. Three VC killed. At 292040H Co M CP received one incoming mortar round. No casualties.

30 Dec. At 301115H 2d Flat Co K saw VC harding out leaflets in CAM NE (2) vicinity (AT 973688). An interpreter with the natrol challenged the two VC who ran. The armed VC was shot and killed while fleeing. The other VC was captured and evacuated to ITT for interrogation. At 301200H a Co L natrol vicinity (AT 953647) received 15 rounds s/a fire. Fire returned, no casualties. Co L CF at 302336H received several s/a rounds and what appeared to be two 60mm mortar rounds. S/A fire and illumination was returned with unknown results. At 302356H a Co L squad ambush vicinity (AT 951651) received 6-8 rounds s/a fire from vicinity (AT 959657). At 301910H Co M CP vicinity (AT 971663) received approximately 300 rounds s/a and a/w fire from an estimated 10 VC vicinity (AT 969665). Slow mortar illumination was fired and 250 s/a rounds returned with unknown results. VC broke contact.

31 Dec. At 311115Ha Co L squad ambush received approximately 50 rounds of a/w fire from vicinity (AT 952644). Returned fire with s/a and 60mm mortar. Results unknown.

#### 1. Summary of the Enemy Situation for the period

#### A. Characteristics of the Area of Operation.

#### (1) Weather.

- (a) Weather continued moderate and without adverse effects on tactical or logistical operations.
- continue in fair condition, with scattered muddy areas but are completely adequate. The MSR along the Western side of the Bn TAOR (actually 1/1's responsibility) is still passable with all culverts in excellent shape but the road is showing signs of deterioration from traffic while the ground is saturated. All bridges are open but pounding from traffic and erosion is damaging the opproaches, though all are still passable with care. The road bed is being severely rutted and chuck-holes are opening. The MSR on the East flank of the TACR (in 2/9's TAOR) is in fair shape. The road to "I" 3/3 is open but deeply rutted and muddy. It is passable but only with care. Engineers are working on this road.

All trail nets are passable to foot traffic with only small areas

submerged.

Paddies are generally flooded only 4-6 inches. Heavy rainfall could result in widespread flooding. Most roads within the TAOR are sufficiently elevated that only a rise of 3 feet or more would seriously affect them. An execption to this, is the road to "I" Co C.P. which is more vulnerable to flooding. Mites and 6x6 trucks can negotiate any major road in the TAOR.

#### INTELLIGENCE REQUIREMENTS

a. The following intelligence requirements are established by reference (a):

#### (1) What was the extent of damage caused by the strike? Personnel? Buildings? Defense works? Terrain?

An estimated 25 Viet Cong were found dead as a result of the SAC strike. From examination it appeared that anyone caught out in the open, and within 75 meters of the blast, was killed, and in most cases had one or more limbs blown off. In one incident, a Merine patrol reported discovering several dead cattle and one dead Viet Cong approximately 50 meters from a bomb crater with no visible marks or wounds on their bodies (a detailed examination was not made). It appeared they could have been killed by concussion from the bombing.

From observation, any buildings (concrete or straw) within 25 meters of the bomb crater were destroyed. Straw huts from 25 meters and further from a bemb crater had little or no damage, indicating their ability to absorb the fraguents and shock of the bombs. Solid structured buildings (concrete or plaster) from 25 to 75 meters from the crater had damage (varied depending on distance from the crater) to the side of the building facing the blast.

If a tunnel, cave, or trench line received a direct hit from the bombing, it was destroyed. Tunnels, cawes, and trench lines discovered from 25 meters and further from the crafter had no damage done to them.

A bomb landing in a rice paddy created a crater approximately 50 feet in diameter and 15 feet deep, and turned up soil out to approximately 50 meters. Reports indicated that trees and brush within 20 meters of the crater were destroyed or up rooted. From 20 meters and further, the trees and brush were scorched, but not extensively damaged.

#### (2) What uniforms were worn by Viet Cong in the area?

Viet Cong encountered in the operating area were dressed in black pajamas, gray uniforms, and khaki uniforms. In addition the Viet Cong were equipped with packs, canteens, entrenching tools, cartridge belts, and in one incident observed wearing steel helmets.

### (3) What weapons were encountered? (Special attention to Aliand AT weapons.)

Weepons encountered during the operation included ChICOM carbines, caliber .30 carbines, K-44's, M-1's (US), Thompson sub-machine guns, 57MM recoilless rifles, 60 MM and 81MM mortars, BAR's, caliber .50 machine guns, hand grenades (assorted), beer traps, booby traps, and punji traps.

### (4) Did Viet Cong in the area resist search forces? To what Degree? Organized resistance? How long after the strike?

The Viet Cong did resist searching forces. An estimated Viet Cong company (reinforced) gave light to moderate resistance. On 9 December the Marines received a heavy volumn of automatic, semi-automatic, and 81 MM mortar fire.

The SAC strike was conducted on 11 December 1965, and Vict Cong organized resistance terminated on 12 December 1965.

# (5) What buildings, tunnels and caves were encountered? What were they used for? Were the buildings old or new? State of upkeep? Were the caves or tunnels new or old? How extensive?

Very extensive natural and man made tunnels and caves were discovered throughout the operating area. Most of the tunnels and caves were approximately 5 feet in height and led into underground rooms approximately 10 feet by 15 feet by 16 feet high, and as large as 30 feet by 30 feet by 10 feet high used mainly for storage of food, weapons, and ammunition, pretection from artillery fire and air strikes, and living quarters. Nost of these caves and tunnels appeared to be old with little new construction visable. Some of the tunnels had side extensions (from one to five) which also led into large rooms approximately the same sizes as indicated above. Underground tunnels in some area contained air and cooking breather openings to the surface.

The buildings in the area consisted mainly of straw and mud huts which were used primarily for living quarters, and in some cases for storage of rice, or other food stuffs. Nost of these buildings appeared old and in need of repair, but which was nothing unusual for this area of the country. A few concrete/plaster buildings were discovered in the operating area which appeared to be used for living quarters. These buildings appeared to be old, but well kept.

### (6) What supply caches were found? How many? What type supplies? How much medicine?

The following is a summary of the supply caches found in the operation areas

- (a) Approximately 4 caches of rice totaling an estimated 75 tons were discovered and destroyed.
- (b) Approximately 4 caches of fish cil, salt, beans, tea, sugar and peanuts totaling an estimated 15 tons were discovered and destroyed.
- (c) Two large caches of "personal comfort" items including approximately 400 tubes of tooth paste, 350 tooth brushes, 50 towels, 100 bars of scap, undetermined amounts of razors and razor blades, smoking tobacco, 2000 writing pens, 50 flashlights, 9 bicycles, and 150 bicycle tire tubes (Japanese manufactured), were discovered and all destroyed except for the bicycles which were evacuated.
- (d) Three clothing caches were discovered consisting of approximately 500 completed gray Viet Cong uniforms, 30 completed black Viet Cong uniforms, 8 completed green Viet Cong uniforms, 15,000 buttons, 7 sewing machines, two helicopter loads of blue/gray material, and a large amount of sewing thread. The uniforms and material were evacuated, and the remainder of the cache was destroyed.
- (e) Two caches of office supplies were discovered including approximately 1200 cubic feet of white paper (blank and lined), one typewriter, 100 typewriter ribbons, and carbon paper.
- (f) Captured weapons included 5 BAR's, 4 M-1's (US), 7-LNG's, 2 Chinese Automatic rifles, 35-K-44's, 7 Unidentified bolt action rifles, 5 Thompson sub-machine guns, 1 Mossin Nagat carbine, 1 US (Stevens) shot-gun (single barrel), 3 unidentified automatic rifles, 1-81MH mortar biped, 35 anti-personnel mines, 42 grenades (assorted), 6 "tomate can" mines, 10 bear traps, 100 magazines (assorted), 39-60MM mortar rounds, 7 mine fuses, 10 rifle flares, and a large amount of small arms ammunition. All the captured weapons were evacuated except the explosives and ammunition which were destroyed.
- (g) One cache of fuel was discovered including 375 gallons of gasoline, and 100 gallons of kerosene all of which was destroyed.
- (h) Two caches of medical supplies were discovered including 1 medical hand bag containing medical instruments, a small emount of malaria tablets, a small amount of dysentary pills, and a few bottles containing liquid medication (unidentified). In addition an estimated 20,000 pills (assorted and unidentified), 8 reams of gauze material, 8 reams of bandage material, 12 sterilizing pots with lids (18 inches in diameter), 1 Russian bottle of penicillin, 1 French tube containing 100 chlorine tablets, 7 surgical uniforms, 4 nurses uniforms and 15 rolls of brown plastic were discovered and evacuated.

## (7) What evidence was found of resupply trails and roads? In what direction did they lead? In what direction did the most-used trails lead?

There were no roads discovered in the operating area. There were several well used trails discovered running NE to SW (SW to NE) through the valley. Most of these trails were located around the base of hills and provided adequate protection from observation. Several well used trails were discovered running SE, S, SW, and W from the valley floor up into the mountains. It is assumed that these trails were used to transport supplies from the south and west. In addition, many foot paths were discovered running between the hamlets, and extending off the main trails described above.

## (8) What is the nature of the terrain? Undergrowth? Canopy? Density of trees? Steepness of nountains?

The valley floor consisted primarily of rice paddies. The valley ran generally NE to SW with mountain ranges to the SE, W, and NW. Most of the hamlets were located at the base of the hills, between the rice paddies and the mountain ranges. The hills surrounding the valley varied in size from 200 to 500 meters in height, and had slopes ranging from 40% to 70%. The hills were covered with thick brush 5 to 8 feet in height, which did not create a canopy. The hills of a height of 400 meters and higher were covered with trees ranging from 70 to 100 feet in height, which created a good canopy, and concealment from air observation.

#### (9) Any evidence of agricultural activity? What kind?

Almost the entire flat land consisted of rice paddies. In a few areas, some rice paddies extended up hill in a terrace fashion. There were also small amounts of bananas (troos), beets, potatoes, and onions grown in the area.

### (10) Any edible animals encountered? How many? Were they maintained as a herd?

An estimated 200 head of cattle were observed throughout the operating area in unattended herds of 15 to 50. Eventhough they were unattended, the cattle stayed as a herd. Most of the hanlets had small numbers of water buffalo, pigs, chickens and ducks around their homes.

### (11) What water supply (supplies) was used by Viet Cong?

Many man made wells were located throughout the hanlets. In addition numerous streams were discovered running down from the mountains into the valley. Both sources provided an adequate water supply for the Viet Cong.

(12) What communication equipment was encountered? (Every effort must be made to capture communications equipment and related documents, codes, message books, etc.)

One cache of communications equipment was captured including 2 AN/PRC-10 radios, 1 AN/PRC-6 radio, 3 TA 312 telephones, 500 flashlight batteries, 5,000 meters of communications wire, 1 loudspeaker (16 inch diameter), 1 unidentified radio, and 1 possible code book. All of the equipment was immediately evacuated to the rear area for evaluation.

#### 1. INTELLIGENCE REQUIREMENTS

a. Reference (b) requires the following information to assess the effectiveness of SAC strikes in the Requblic of Viet Nam:

#### (1) Describe the type of terrain and vegetation in the area.

The terrain in the strike area consisted of a valley running NE to SW, with mountain ranges to the NW, W, S, and SE, the hills of which ranged from 200-500 meters in height. The valley floor consisted mainly of rice paddies and stream bods, with some rice paddies extending up hill in a terrace fashion. Most of the hamlets and villages were located at the base of the hills between the rice paddies and the mountain ranges. The hills were covered with thick tangled brush from 6 to 8 feet in height. The hills ranging from 400 feet and higher were covered with trees ranging from 70 to 100 feet in height, providing a good canopy, and protection from air observation. The slopes of the hills ranged from 40% to 70%.

#### (2) What Viet Cong units were located in the target area prior to the strike? Describe Viet Cong installations in the area.

It is not known what Viet Cong units were located in the target area before the SAC strike. Captured personnel and material indicating Viet Cong units were not interrogated or processed through the Battalien S-2, but were evacuated to higher headquarters from the point of capture.

Viet Cong installations consisted primarily of straw huts, stone buildings, caves, and tunnels. Very extensive natural and manuale tunnels and caves were discovered throughout the operating area. Most of the tunnels and caves were approximately 5 feet in height and led into underground rooms approximately 10 feet by 15 feet by 10 feet high, and as large

weapons, and amounition, protection from artillery fire and air strikes, and living quarters. Most of these caves and tunnels appeared to be old with little new construction visable. Some of the tunnels had side extensions (from one to five) which also led into large rooms approximately the same sizes indicated dove. Underground tunnels in some areas contained air and cooking breather openings to the surface.

The buildings in the area consisted mainly of straw and mud huts which were used pringrily for living quarters, and in some cases for storage of rice, or other food stuffs. Most of these buildings appeared old and in need of repair, but is nothing unusual for this area of the country. A few concrete/plaster buildings were discovered in the operating area which appeared to be used for living quarters. These buildings appeared to be old, but well kept. In addition a few tin buildings (barboo frames) were discovered which appeared to be used for storage, and offices by the Viet Cong.

# (3) What casualties were inflicted on Viet Cong personnel by the strike? What damage was done to Viet Cong installations including underground structures? To civilian personnel and installations?

An estimated 25 Vict Cong and 3 Vietnamese civilians were found dead as a result of the SAC strike. From examination it appeared that anyone caught out in the open, and within 75 meters of the blast, was killed. In most cases, these bodies had one or more limbs blown off. In one incident, a Marine patrol discovered several dead cattle and one dead Viet Cong approximately 50 meters from a bomb crater with no visible marks or wounds on their bodies (a detailed examination was not made). It appeared they could have been killed by concussion from the bombing.

From observation, any buildings (concrete or straw) within 25 meters of the bomb crater were destroyed. Straw huts from 25 meters and further from a bomb crater had little or no damage, indicating their ability to absorb the fragments and shock of the bombs. Solid structured buildings (concrete or plaster) from 25 to 75 meters from the crater had damage (varied depending on distance from the crater) to the side of the building facing the blast.

If a tunnel, cave, or trench line received a direct hit from the bombing, it was destroyed. Tunnels, caves, and trench lines discovered from 25 meters and further from the crater had no damage done to them.

#### (4) What type of damage was incurred by target (burning, fragmentation, blast perforation)? Include dimentions of craters.

If a bonb landed in a rice paddy, 90% of the damage was caused by the blast, with secondary damage inflicted by fragmentation. There was no damage observed in the rice paddy areas as a result of burning. Craters observed in rice paddies were approximately 40 to 50 feet in diameter, and 15 to 20 feet deep.

In some areas, the rice paddles extended up hill in a terrace fashion. If a bomb landed in this area, the blast and fragmentation effect was reduced as a result of the rock and dirt terrace (dike), and the slope of

the hill. Craters discovered in this area were approximately 8 to 10 feet deep, and 40 feet in diameter. There was no evidence of damage as a result of burning.

Bombs that landed in areas covered with trees and heavy brush created craters approximately 30 to 50 feet wide, and 10 to 20 feet deep.

Most damage was done by the blast and fragmantation, with secondary damage inflicted from burning.

#### (5) What was the effect of terrain and vegatation on the weapons?

Terraced rice paddies, trees, thick brush, and steep slopes reduced the blast and fragmentation effect to a certain degree depending on the density of the trees and brush, and slope of the hills and terraces.

#### (6) What was the effect of weapons on vegatation and terrain?

Bombs detonating in rice paddies or open terrain, created a large crater as described in question 4. From the crater out to approximately 150 feet, the soil was torn up, destroying any crops that were growing.

In wooded and brush covered areas, the bombs created craters as described in question 4. Reports indicated that trees as thick as 2 feet in diameter and located within 10 meters of the crater were splintered and ripped apart from the blast and fragmantation. In addition brush and trees located within 50 meters of the crater were burned and scorched (damage varied according to distance from crater).

## (7) Were there indications of fore knowledge of the strike? Did the Viet Cong evacuate the area prior to the strike?

There were no visible indications that the Viet Cong had prior knowledge of the strike. From the dead Viet Cong found in the target area, it appeared most of them were caught out in the open.

It is not known whether the Viet Cong withdrew before or after the SAC strike. From the encunt of captured material, it appears that when the Viet Cong left, they left in a hurry.

## (8) What evasive or protective techniques were employed by the Viet Cong during the strike?

It was evident that the Viet Cong sought shelter in the many caves and tunnels discovered in the target area. There were no other protective techniques discovered that were employed by the Viet Cong.

### (9) What were the psychological effects of the strike on Viet Cong? On civilians?

A search of the target area after the strike revealed several Vietnamese civilians hiding in caves and shelters. Two Vietnamese discovered in one cave appeared to be in shock, and could not talk to the interpreter. Another family found in a home shelter said they were

scared to death because the bombs sounded louder and more frightening than anything they ever heard. The civilians indicated they had not left the shelters since the bombing.

It cannot be determined what psychological effect the strike had on the Viet Cong because it cannot be determined if the Viet Cong left the valley before or after the strike. All Viet Cong captured were not interrogated by the Battelion S-2 but were immediately evacuated to higher headquarters from point of capture.

(10) Have any Viet Cong rallied due to strikes? Have any civilians returned to GVN control? Describe their complete reaction to the strikes.

It is not known how many Viet Cong rallied as a result of the strike. No Viet Cong rallied to the Third Battalion, Third Marines as a result of the strike.

There were a total of 48 Vietnamese civilians who requested, and

were granted, relocation in an area under GVN control.

All of these civiliens requested evacuation from the "fighting erea", and the "Viet Cong". The only civilians that mentioned the strike were those mentioned in question 9.

  - (7) School-trained snipers are to be employed with a minimum of a fire team for security, and are to be so positioned that their vantage point will fall within small arms range and observation. of their company or plateon primary position.
  - (8) Companies will employ a minimum of one company sniper per day during normal operations. This is in addition to utilization of school-trained snipers. Such designated company snipers may be employed on patrols or other operations, or from a vantage point within his unit's position.
  - (9) When "Hay Day" is directed, companies will cancel such night activities as necessary, and establish a minimum of four ambushes per platoon.

- (15) Fatrol overlays will be submitted to this headquarters (S-3) by 1200 daily and at least 72 hours in advance. Changes for patrol activities will be submitted to this headquarters (S-3) by 1200 on the day such activity is scheduled to be executed.
- (16) Rules of Engagement are in effect and are as follows:
  - (a) Individual.
    - 1. Rounds will not be chambered in individual weapons unless contact with the enemy is imminent. The senior Marine present will determine if, in his judgement, this measure must be taken to preserve the lives of USMC personnel. Initiation of any offensive or defensive formation implies imminent contact with the enemy.
    - 2. Magazines will not be inserted in weapons in a camp area during day light hours unless under attack.
    - During the hours of darkness the sequence of engagement will be:
      - a. Challenge
      - b. If the person challenged makes an overt attempt to avoid apprehension, opens fire or commits any other hostile act, and therefore endangers the life of the challenger, the challenger may load and fire.
      - to firing if local circumstances allow.
      - d. The requirement for challenge may be waived by the local commander if required by the tactical situation and friendly forces are known to be not operating in the area.

## (b) Unit.

Supporting arms will not be fired into any populated area except when the infantry commander on the ground personally determines that such action is necessary to save Marine lives, and that there is no alternative to such a course of action.

- 2. All supporting arms missions except pre-planned barrages will be approved positively at the appropriate FSCC level prior to the use of supporting arms.
- None of the foregoing is intended to deny the application of force against the source of hostile fires. Enemy forces engaging friendly troops will be destroyed by utilization of any available means.
- (17) All artillery fires must be approved through this Headquarters.

  81mm illumination, WT and HE fires are to be requested and approved through this Headquarters, except in those cases in which the Company Commander deems an emergency to exist. In such cases, Company Commanders are delegated the authority to fire 31mm illumination, WT or HE fires, and to report subject fire missions to this headquarters at the earliest opportunity.

#### 1. SUMMARY OF THE ENEMY SITUATION.

- a. The VC has the capability to mass up to six battalions at the time and place of his choosing. It has been the enemy's usual tactic to mass smaller units—to a degree necessary to have an over-whelming force for employment against targets of their choice. A more common employment has been small units attacking by relatively long range, heavy volume small arms fire with a hope of inflicting casualties and harassing Marine and Vietnamese units. VC units have disdained holding fixed positions and exhibited, characteristically, a high degree of foot mobility. In any given area the VC may be expected to maintain at least a cadre of guarrillas capable of harassing with mines, booby traps or small arms, conducting terrorist or propaganda campaigns, maintaining a measure VC control by representing the VC in the hamlet and collecting information on Vietnamese and Marine military activities.
- b. VC weapons available include the standard small arms, such as carbines both Chinese Communist and U.S.; French, German and U.S. rifle, machine guns and submachine guns. Heavy reliance is placed on captured and recovered weapons and ammunition of U.S. and Vietnamese units. Positive programs of weapons control are necessary. Hand grenades of VC, CHI COM and U.S. manufacture are common, with the U.S. M-26 grenade a favorite for close combat and booby trapping.
- c. VC mining and booby trapping activities have been historically heavy in the battalion TAOR. Troops must be made aware of the VC propensity for mining gates, paths and fence lines where troops are channelized. Mines usually are made of grenades, either pressure actuated, or trip wired for pull devices and electrically detonated. Mines are used mainly for casualty producing effect and are not designed to channelize persons into killing zones for other weapons. Anti-vehicular mines are often electrically detonated so that the mine can be controlled to take advantage of lone vehicles or especially attractive targets. When an anti-vehicle mine is detonated the VC may be expected to attempt to recover any weapons on the vehicle. Immediate reaction by surviving occupants and other vehicles is necessary.

d. Currently located enemy units are as shown in the following table. VC strengths are not available. VC units move frequently, therefore the table is useful mainly to indicate locations used by the VC, approximate size of units these sites can contain, and approximate size and comparative strength of enemy units operating in this area at any given time.

- 3. MECONNAISSANCE AND O SERVATION MISSIONS. All units rejert results of all patrols, to include details of enemy contacts, VC mining and booky trapping, VC fortifications, tunnels and caves. Additionally information on trail nets, stream crossings, water supply and cover, concealment and observation along patrol routes. Units should be alert for enemy propaganda efforts and for opportunities for friendly psychological activities including civic action programs.
- Weasures For Handling leasonnel, cartured occurents and cartured material.

  Viet Cong cartured by this lattali n will be targed with date and time of carture, coordinates of carture, circumstances of carture, carturing squal or unit and name of person effecting carture. Any documents found on persons apprehended will be targed to identify them with the person on whom found and evacuated with the individual. Whenever ressible, a person present at the apprehension of a VC or VCS will be detailed as a prisoner guard to accompany the individual to ITT.

Captured VC or apprehended VCS will have their hands bound and blindfolded before delivery to ITT. As a general rule women, children, and old men will not be apprehended as VC suspects unless circumstances indicate reason to suspect VC orientation. The circumstances of apprehension related on the tag filled out at the time of apprehension will indicate the reason for aspecting the person apprehended is a VC. Evacuation will be by surface means whenever possible. Inform the Battalion S-2 whenever a VC or VCS is forwarded, including name, age, home hamlet of person apprehended, and VC rank and affiliation, if known. Wounded VC or VCS will be evacuated in the medical chain, if medically indicated. All weapons or material captured will be evacuated to G-2 via battalion and regiment tagged with date-time group and coordinates of capture, identification of capturing unit and circumstances of capture or recovery. If the item qualifies for return and retention as a war trophy the name, rank an! scrial number of the person responsible for its capture should be affixed. Documents from VC dead will be tagged and sent to S-2.

#### 5. COUNTERINTELLIGENCE.

The VC have displayed a marked ability to gather information by visiting unit positions in the guise of vendors, rag pickers, sick or injured seeking aid, or merely wandering into Marine positions. Stringent steps must be taken to prevent any unauthorized Vietnamese from observing friendly positions. Terrorist tactics including poisoning of beer, soft drinks and water by vendors, or the planting of explosives by children or vendors, must be guarded against.

#### 1. SUMMARY OF ENEMY SITUATION

a. The VC organization throughout Central Vietnam is composed of three dis inct, but interconnected levels. The first is a loosely organized system of couriers and informers who keep the VC informed of USMC and GVN disposition, movements and plans, and warn the VC when they are endangered by our units. These sympathizers also furnish food, shelter, and aid. On the second level are guerrilla forces that may be full time guerrillas or organized as needed and, when not functuioning as guerrillas, return to civilian pursuits. The third level are the full time soldiers organized into regular, oftentimes uniformed and well equipped, units. This objective area contains all three levels.

c. Encmy Strength and weapons. (See Appendix 1). Subordinate companies of CHU DUNG Dn have strengths of: 1st Co, 60 men; 2nd Co, 146 men; 3rd Co, 144 men; and 4th Co, 100 men. The battalion headquarters has approximately 50 men including a signal squad and medical squad. The battalion is confirmed to be operating in the QUE SON area. Weapons available to these companies are unknown. The VC 1ST Regiment has displayed a capability of organizing and controlling a regimental size unit in a tactical situation. It may be assumed that it has sufficient communication facilities and personnel to effectively coordinate regimental size operations. There exists a distinct possibility of VC monitaring or entering our radio nets.

Enemy anti-aircraft weapons have been recently reported at (BT 047263) and (BT 021305), but may have been moved due to U.S. Counter action. The extent of VC anti-aircraft capability is not known but it may be assumed that these sites employ 12.7MM machine guns as a minimum, with an effective AA range of 1000 to 2000 meters depending on the type and ammunition. They recently downed a U.S. helicopter on 3 December 1965.

The 400TH Artillery Battalion at NUI GIAI (BT 0427) is reported

but not confirmed. Probable armament might include 75RR.

d. Recent Enemy activity. The VC have considered this area as being relatively secure. They have engaged in terrorism and harrassing raids on small units. On 23 November (?) the VC, probably utilizing elements of the IST Regiment, overran the District Headquarters at HIEP DUC (AT 911245). The casualties on both sides were heavy.

During December they have not launched any major attack but indications are that they have scheduled or planned attacks on either QUE SON District Headquarters (BT 045348) or VIET AN District

Headquarters (BT 0328).

Much VC activity has been devoted to destruction of the read net on routes 35, 82, and National Highway 1. There have been activities such as cutting ditches across the read or partially across the read and blowing many bridges. Traffic has been mined or stopped by VC units, and vehicles destroyed, persons kidnapped, or property confiscated. The object of these operations has been terrorizing of the populace, isolation of the GVN Forces in the area and obtaining some supplies, as well as displaying the degree of VC control over the area. The read cutting activities will have the most effect on planned operations by GVN and U.S. Forces since they will make use of the scanty read impractical.

f. Time and Space Factors. Several VC Companies are located south of the objective area as are several companies and at least five battalions to the north, but it is unlikely that the VC will reinforce with these units. The VC could, if the enemy chose, move five battalions from the DA NANG Sector and have them in the operation area in 48 hours with lead elements arriving in twelve hours. Company size forces from the south could begin arriving within eight hours.

- HIEP DUC, most VC elements in this area have not been heavily engaged recently and the LST VC Regiment has been reorganizing, refitting, training and resting. There are suspected to be several VC supply staging areas, training areas and a hespital in the operation area or the hills immediately surrounding it, so the VC should be in a high state of logistical readiness, and able to resupply on an emergency basis those units able to reach the supply points.
- h. Personnel Considerations. The status of training of VC personnel must be considered as relatively high. This area serves as training ground and has actual combat experience for the VC. Over an extended period some replacements might be made available to VC units from training areas in the hills. The quality of these replacements would probably be lower due to lack of training, indoctrination and experience. Loss of trained mortar men, communications, nedical personnel or other specialists and loss of officers and NCO's would result in a difficult situation for the VC and might have long term implications.
  - i. Reinforcements. Due to lack of mechanized transportation and difficulty of daytime movements for the VC, large scale reinforcement is not too likely. Available trainees, in unknown numbers, might be available, as might several hundred replacements from various units outside the actual area of operations. Possibly two companies of local forces 107TH and 108TH might enter the area from the Northeast and units in DIEN BAN might be sent Southward in undetermined strength. From the South units available are:
    - (1) A-16 Company at (BT 1924), strength 120 men.
    - (2) A-19 Company at (BT 3411), strength 140 to 200 men.
    - (3) A-21 Comapny at (BT 3315), strength 80 men.

#### 2. ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS OF INFORMATION

- a. Will the VC resist our entry into the objective area; if so, where and in what strength?
- b. What is VC strength in the objective area; how disposed?
- c. What tactics will VC employ; delaying, counterattack or withdrawal
- d. What is local populace's attitude toward our forces?
- e. What VC organized units are operating within the objective area?

f. Does the enemy have artillery in the objective area? If so, determine type, caliber, and where located.

# 3. RECONNAISSANCE AND OBSERVATION MISSIONS ORDERS TO

a. Subordinate units. All units will collect, record and report all information on VC activities, strength and contacts. Detailed information on all contacts such as time, coordinates, weapons, strength, uniforms and tactics employed must be reported using a tactical spot report format.

ability, fords, bridges and choke points and other positions that may effect future operations in this area. Included in this are

VC positions, evidence of VC activity and simular items.

- b. kequests to higher adjacent and supporting units. Aerial reconnaissance of objective area and all available photos are requested for use by this headquarters.
- nent of chemical warfare. All units report evidence of VC employment of chemical warfare. All incoming fire will be reported to include time of fire, number of rounds received (estimated), direction of firing point as well as the position of the unit receiving fire. Identify the type of weapon(s) involved if at all possible.

# 4. ME SURES FOR HANDLING PRISONERS, CAPTURED & CUMENTS AND CAPTURED MATERIAL

- will be tagged to show time and place of capture, circumstances of capture and capturing unit. It is the responsibility of the capturing unit to deliver prisoners to the collection point.
- b. Captured documents and material. All documents and material of possible intelligence value will be tagged in the same manner as prisoners and evacuated to the Battalien S-2. Items desired as war trophies must also bear the name, rank, serial number and organization of the capturing individual.
- 5. MAPS AND PHOTOGRAPHS. AMS Series L701, VIETNAM, 1:50,000 is designated as the standard tactical map for this operation. Units are furnished sheets 6658 II, III; 6657 I, and IV of this series. This will be used for all references and overlays.

## 6. COUNTERINTELLIGENCE

- a. See Division Intelligence SCP (Div0 P3800.1).
- b. Countersigns (Special Distribution)
- c. Propaganda and psychological warfare will be conducted as directed.

7. REPORTS AND DISTRIBUTION. No special periodic reports are required, however spot reports of intelligence information on as occurred basis and after the operation a report of the information collected in accordance with paragraph 3. c. above within 72 hours from companies and attached units.

## 1. Concept of Operations.


Special Londing Force Delta consisting of two Marine Battalians, the Special Londing Force, 7th Fleet (SLF), and other supporting 3d Mar Div elements in coordination with an ARVN Regiment, will conduct a three stage search and destroy operation in the QUE SON-VIET AN-HIEP AC valley complex. Marine logistic support will be from an established base complex, in the vicinity of HUONG XUAN.

#### b. Defination of Stages.

- (1) Stage I. Period D-1 and D-day. D-1 AMVN forces search and destronemy forces in vicinity of THANG BINH. D-day ARVN forces cross LD at 0500H proceed generally Southwest along Route 35 to vicinity Phase Line B. Btry M, 4th Dn, 11th Marines, with one rifle platoon from 2/7, moves by motor march from CHU LAI enclave to vicinity of Phase Line B. 2d Dn, 7th Marines motor marches from CHU LAI to vicinity TAM KY.
- (2) Stage II. Period D+1 to D+10. ALVN forces maintain contact enemy force. 2d Bn, 7th Marines is helilifted on D+1 to vicinity Objective 1, seize objective and is then prepared to move out to seek out and destroy the enemy as ordered. On D+1 all other elements of task force except SLF moves from DA NANG enclave to either the THANG BINH or QUE SON complex. Btry M, 4th Dn, 11th Marines continues to support from position at HUCNG XUAN. 3d Bn, 3d Marines and SLF prepare for immediate commitment to objective area on creder. Logistic Support Unit supports force from D+1 to D+10 from LSA vicinity HUCNG XUAN. Force Command Group, Prov Arty Bn (-), Recon-Co (-) bases at QUE SON.ON D+1. No major displacement of this element, with the exception of the Recon Co (-), is contemplated prior to D+10.
- (3) Stage III. D+11 to D+12. All elements of Task Force Delta withdraw by helo/foot/motor march to their respective enclaves. ISA transfers surplus supplies to FLSG control in enclave. Operation HARVEST MOON terminates D+12.

# Special Report "Operation Five Mountains"

Idna Company arrived in LE SON (3) (AT 963677) and CAM NE (4) (AT 968695) areas on 29 November. Idna-1 was located et CAM NE (4) and Lina -2 and Company Cr located at LA BONG(3). The Pacification Team arrived at LA BONG (3) on 30 November. The villagers were invited to a necting with the Pacification Tean nembers. At 1400 on the same day the Company Commander was invited to speak to the villagers through his interpreter. The Company Commander expressed the desire of the American people to help the Vietnamese People in their strive for freedon. He explained that his nen were there to help and protect them. The things he said were very well accepted by the people present. They were pleased with his attempt to say "Hello" in Vietnamese. On behalf of the Pacification Tean he presented each family head with one Ration. He explained to the people that his Corpsnen in conjunction with the Tacification Tean Corpsnen would conduct Sick Call Daily at 0900.

When Company L errived a census of LA BONG (3) showed 17 femilies with 98 people living there. Since Company L's errival the femily count has grown to 31 with 157 people. People are returning to the Hamlet because they feel that they will be protected from the VC. Likewise the sick call has increased 100%. The people are showing more and more trust and confidence in the Pacification Team and the Marines.

Company L has helped the Pacification Team to prepare their signs and have accompanied them on all their Pacification efforts.

The Pacification Team at Lina 1's position is conducting a census, Med Cap and Psychological Warfare in their area at CAM NE (3) (AT 962685). The Pacification Team from La BONG (3) has proceeded to LA PONG (1) (AT 967670) to conduct a similar program.

Lima one reports that the people in CAM NE (3) are extremel receptive to the Pacification Teams and the Marines. The Med Cap program in the CAM NE (3) area has tripled within

the last few days.

On 6 December 1965 a patrol which accompanied Pacification
Team to LA BONG (1) was very well received. A meeting was
held and 118 villagers were present. The meeting was held
for 2½ hours. Immediately after the meeting L/3/3 Corpsmen
in conjunction with the Pacification Team corpsmen held
Med Cap however they did not have sufficent medical supplies
to treat all the people who needed it. After the Med Cap
villagers took some of the Marines in the squad and showed
them two booby trapped grenades which were located at (AT 97566
The grenades were destroyed. The villagers at LA BONG (1)
are very receptive and friendly to the Pacification Teams
and the Marines.

No unfamorable incidents have occured as of yet. The Marines are not allowed to buy anything from the people. The villagers have given Marines firewood and have cooked

rice for them.

Strength: 22 Officers, 693 Enlisted, 10 USN Enlisted.

Time: 090500H to 181700H December 1965.

Place: Area of operations enclosed by GS BT 1532, BT 1525, BT 0532, and BT 0525. The logistical support area was located in vic GS BT 1545.

Casualties: Friendly - 11 KIA, 51 WIA, 15 non-battle.
Enemy - 101 KIA, 120 KIA probable, 79 VCS evacuated.

Nature of Action: Operation HARVEST MOON, a search and destroy operation which was essentially a spoiling attack to prevent the Viet Cong from their announced objective of capturing QUE SON, and also to eliminate VC forces that isolated the ARVN outpost at VIET AN, permitting ARVN to reestablish lines of communications.

2. Summary. On 090500H 3d Bn, 3d Mer departed it's CP by motor march for the site of the ISA vic coord (BT 155455). Initial elements arrived at 091030H, established a defensive perimeter, and preparations began immediately for a heliborne assualt. At 091400H battalion helilift began to LZ coord (BT 144306) with the mission of reinforcing an ARVN Regt under attack 2500 meters to the NW of the LZ. At 091500H Co. L moved out toward the West with the Command Group and two plateons of Co. E in trace. At 091530, leading elements of Co. L made contact. Movement continued in a Westerly direction until approximately 091645H when a turn North was made in order to move to Hill 43 coord (BT 123321) where remnants of the ARVN bettalion were supposed to be located. Movement continued North until 091700H when a heavy volume of small arms, automatic weapons, and mortar fire were received from the North, Northwest and West. An intense fire fight lested until approximately 091830H. As a result of the fire fight eleven friendly KIA's and seventeen friendly WLA's were evacuated by heliconter. Estimated enemy losses were seventy five KIA's. Periodic small arms fire was received until approximately 092030H. At approximately 092000H a HULE was shot down while attempting a medical evacuation. Engineers destroyed the aircraft after the rescue of the crew and removal of weapons was completed. There was no further enemy contect during the night. Defensive positions for the night were established by the Command Group, Co. L, and two platoons or Go. E vicinity coord. (BT 122316). Co G and one plateon of Co E established night defensive positions in the LZ coord (Bt 144306). At 101300H the bettalion consclidated on Hill 43 coord (BT 123321).

Lt 101430H the battalion moved from Hill 43 to Hill 63 coord (3T 083525) and arrived at 101730H. Night defensive positions were established and contact was established with Co II, 2d Dr., 7th Har. Commany sized search and elear patrols were conducted on 11 December East and West of Hill 63 to a dustance of 1800 - 2000 meters. Six of wors apprehended and a fortified complex was found at coord (DT 075324). At 120900H battalion helilift began to LE coord (DT 145285). The helilist was completed at 121015H. The battelions mission was to search and clear PHUCC II walley, and to assess the effectiveness of the 5/C strike by B-52's conducted on the norming of 12 December. In order to accomplish the mission it was necessary to secure the entrance to Thuc h. valley. This was accomplished by 121805h with Co L securing Hill 100 coord (DT 128285) and Co G securing Hill 100 coord (BT 139275). The assualt by Co G on Hill 180 was by helicopter. Sporadio contacts were nade throughout the day by all companies. At 121345 the 2d Reconn Co, 2d ARVN Divison errived at the battalion CF coord (DT 145285) and were placed under the operational control of 3d Bn, 3d Mar. Night defensive positions were established with Co L on Hill 100, Co G on Hill 180, Co E and 2d Reconn Co at the battalion CP. At 130000H Co E followed by the 2d Reconn Co entered THUCC HA valley beginning search and clear operations within the valley. The battalion CP completed displacement to hill 100 at 131445 . Search and clear operations were conducted in and outside the valley thru 16 December. At 15150 H Co L was relieved by Co G 2d Bn, 4th Mar. All commanies participated extensively in searching and results were highly satisfactory. See paragraph three which is a consolidated listing of weapons and sumplies found. The majority of weapons and sumplies found were evacuated to Que Son. During the search period sporadic contacts were made. On 17 December the battalion began its movement by foot from PHDCC HL velley to Highway 1 in order to link up with a truck convoy for return to the D/ N/NG area. First elements began movement at 170805H. Movement progressed setisfactorly until approximately 171630H. Progress was halted due to the flooded condition of the SUCI PHU XU/N river vicinity (PT 179313). 1. reconnsissance for a possible fording site proved negative. Movement by helicopter to Highway 1 was requested and Co G, 2d Bn, 4th Mar, and the 2d Recorn Co, 2d ARVN Division were lifted out just prior to adverse weather and light conditions setting in. I night defense was established at occard (. I 175313) by the Command Group and Companies G and E. No contact was made during the night. It 130830h the remaining elements were lifted to coord (No 238315), by motor merch at 181130H and arrived at the ISA at 181235H. Movement: from the ISA to respective locations of parent organizatio s was accomplished by heli-lift and completed by 181900h. 3d Bn, 3d Mer OHOP from operational control of TANK FURCE DELTA at 181700H.

e. Company L. 3d Bn. 3d Mer. 0905COM December 1965 the company departed Detuation CD in a truck convey (no enemy contact on route to 15.). 091400M departed IS/ on helicopters and landed in IZ coord (BT 144306) at 091430M. Established perimeter defense of IZ. Picked up one VC in IZ who was waving a white hendkerchief. Bettalion Command Post Group, with attachments, landed and entire unit departed IZ at 1500M. At 091500M moved in a Westerly direction and swept coord (IT 137311) CHIEN LCN Village. Captured one VC in village. Moved Westerly to coord (IT 133314). In one house in this village an Olumn House bipod and one Slam HE round was found with two VC; destroyed one transl; one WD bag; a me clething with blood on it and some VC documents (Interpreter identified them as VC napers) were also found.

Continued to move West and came under light small arms fire from coord (RT 124303). Returned fire and moved into area and micked un one dead VC and three VC priseners, one of them in possession of a BAR. Other gear found included: Cartridge belt with Chi-Com grenades attached and a VC travel kit containing a stove, 10 lbs rice, mess ran, clothing, and a caretype foodstuff. At the Western end of the village four VC were cantured, one of whom was identified by the interpreter as the village chief and definitely VC. Crossed the stream which bordered village on the South and apprehended 3 VC in a cave, one of whom was carrying a RAR. Gear found in the cave included a cartridge belt with Chi-Com grenades attached and an E-Tool. At this point an LZ was designated at coord (RT 130310) and all VC gear was evacuated. The company recrossed the stream and continued movement in a Westerly direction and come under light small arms fire from coord (BT 118309). Fire was returned and movement continued. At 091650H executed turning movement to North. Noved in this direction for amproximately 10 minutes and at 091700H the first rounds of the ensuing battle were fired. To clarify the following action, at this time the various units were located as follows:

2d Platoon - Facing North deployed along left flank at coord (T (BT 119311).

3d Platoon - Facing North deployed along right flank and on line at coord (BT 122312).

1st Platoon - Located at coord (BT 122309) and in process of executing turning movement to North.

8lmm - in trace of 1st Platoon and located at coord (BT 124300).

At 091700H with the units in the preceding locations the VC forces orened up with a heavy volume of small arms and automatic fire from the North, Northwest, and West. The VC forces were estimated as 100 VC to the North, 50 VC to the Northwest, and 50 VC to the West. Within the next five minutes the 2d Platoon deployed to a position where they could deliver fire to the enemy on the West and Northwest; the company's 60mm mortars began delivering fire to the enemy on the North, and 3d Platoon began returning fire to the North and Northwest.

The ensuing battle lasted an hour and a half and the following incidents are in approximate chronological sequence (some of them happened simul-

tancously):

- Enemy fire commenced from the rear (estimated force to be 100 VC).
- Incoming mortars began falling in the village to the Mast and the rice paddy West of the village (approximately 35 rounds fell in the village and about 6 rounds fell in the rice paddy).

- First platoon deployed along cemetery mounds, somewhat on line facing South, and began delivering fire on enemy to rear.

- Incoming morters were now detected as also coming from the rear approximately 15 rounds).
- Third platoon received order to assault hill to front (Morth).

- Second plateen got into position to act as base of fire for the third plateen.

- First plateon reported they were still receiving fire to the rear (from the South).

- 8lam morters began delivering fire on enery to "orth.
- Air strikes were being called on enemy to North and Northwest.
- 2d plateon corcuenced base of fire.
- 3d platoon, with 2 squads, ascaulting hill
- Intillary and air began to blast many wesitions to Worth and Porthwest. "Is 3d mlatern was assurbting hill, aircraft made
- strike on enemy to the rear (South) the bill.
- Friendly artillery bogan falling 100 meters North of the 3d mlatoon.
- Aircraft were conducting strikes to the West and Worthwest.
- 1st platoon was now receiving fir from their West.
- A HU-LE came in from the South to attempt medical evacuation.
- Automatic fire from the West hit the milet and the helicerter crashed in the rice had 'y in the midst of the 1st plateon who were evacuating wounded at this time.
- Mumbers of the holicopter crew were nulled out of the downed aircraft.
- 2d platoon moved East from their resition to establish a secure IZ for medical evacuation.
- All casualties to be evacuated from the 1st mlatoon and aircraft crew were now at collection moint coerd (BT 123310).
- All casualties of 2d mlatoon, 3d mlatoon, Bn Cr Group and Co E were now at evacuation point coord (BT 123314), which was arproximately 400 meters from 1st mlatoon collection point.
- 1st plateon ordered to evacuate all casualties to Bn evacuation point.
- Medical exacuation helicopter began to arrive and all casualties began reverent to LZ.
- All casualties were evacuated.
- 2d pl. toon neved onto hill with 3d platoen.
- Engineers destroyed UH-1E with explosives.
- 1st platoon never down trail to West of village and joined company on the hill.
- Company set up nerimeter defense on the hill for the night.

At 100930H company arrived on Hill 43 and linked un with approximately 40 ARM. Company set up perimeter defense on hill. 101000H the 3d platcon ruc ived order to conduct patrol to the Northwest to coord (BT 117328) with mission to find the ANVN Regimental Commanders body, who was prenumed billed during previous engagement between ARVN and VC units (secondary mission included the finding of any dead, wounded, or wearons that were left in the area). At 101200H the 3d plateon reported they had found the body of the Arithm Regimental Commander plus three other dead APVN, 1 dead VC, 5 wearons (1 Chi-Com Auto-Rifle, 2 M-1, 1 Thompson, 1 BAR) cartridge belt with M-1 aumunition, and 2 RVN packs. The body of the APVN Regimental Commander was evacuated by helicorter. At 101300H the 3d plateon returned to Hill 13. At 101530H commenced move and arrived at Hill 63 at 101730H. 3d plateon provided LZ security at the objective and the remainder of the company tied in with 3d platoon and other units to form defense of hill. No energy contact during night (during night commany received word that 1 WC had infiltrated defensive perimeter). At 110900H found 1 VC in cave within perimeter (believed to be some VC that had infiltrated during the night) At 111200H commonced commony natural to search and clear area 2000 meters East of Hill 63. (Grid Squeres RT 0832, BT 0833, BT 0932 and BT 0933). Approhented 5 VC males and 1 VC female.

At 120900H commonced helicorter lift to coord (RT 143300). At 121030H departed LZ in Southwest direction toward Hill 100 coord (BT 128285). At 121130H spotted approximately 10 to 15 VC moving across Hill 100, called in artillery and air strikes on hill. Arrived on Hill 100 at approximately 121300H and set up perimeter defense. At 121315H one reinforced squad sent out to investigate trench line encountered on Northeast slope of hill. Squad snotted 2 VC floring the area; the sound orened fire and wounded one of the VC. Squad returned and the wounded VC was evacuated. On 13 December 1965 remained in mesitions on Hill 100. At 140800H the 2d and 3d plateens moved out on a search natrol of PHINC Hr. valley. One sewing machine case was found at the base of Hill 100 coord (BT 132283) by the Commany CP group. Two 155 duds were found at coord (ET 133278). These duds were marked by the engineers. VC uniforms and two sewing machines were found at coord (BT 136274) by the second platoon. The 2d plateen destroyed 20,000 mounds of rice and 1500 mounds of salt in caves at the base of Hill 160. At 141130H began to evaluate the darage of the B-52 strikes. Craters were found that were 40 ft. wide and 30 ft. deep. Around these craters were VC 782 gear (E-trols, canteens, ammunitions and aid kits), 1Chi-Con carbino, a great deal of medical surnlies, and approximately 3000 mounds of rice were found by the 3d mlatoon. The damage by the B-52 was astrumling. Approximately 12 to 15 VC hodies were found in the rice maddi s. Dead cottle (15-20) were also found throughout the bembed area. At 141315H the 2d rlateen was ordered to search the South side of the valley. On the search or ration 400 tubes of tooth maste, 350 tooth brushes, 50 towels, 100 bars of soan, 2 cans of fish oil, and 2 cans of fuel were found at coord (BT 122265). A man was found at coord (BT 122264) as well as some deeds. The 3d mlatoon scarched the Morth side of the valley. During this search approximately 10 tens of ricewere destroyod. At 151500H company heli-lifted to IS coord (PT 153457). Company was lifted from the ISA to 3d Bn, 3d Mer Cr.

b. Company E, 2d Bn, 9th Marines. At 090530 two plateens Company E departed 3d Bn, 3d For CP on truck convey to assembly area at HOING VIIAN vicinity coord (BT 155455). 3d plateon demarted 091230H with Co G. No enemy contact enroute. Co E (-) arrived at 091030H and assured defensive mesitions vicinity ISA. At 091430H Co E (-) was helilifted to an LZ at coord (BT 144305) and commenced movement Northwest towards Hill 43. At 091650H while Co L and the Bn CP were noving around hamlet HUNG 100 coord (BT 122311), Co E (-) recieved permission to search the hamlet in-Co L and the Bn CP came under stand of following the Bn CP. heavy small arms, automatic wearons and mortar fire, from the Morthwest, West and Southwest. The 1st platoon Co E started receiving fire from the haulet (North), the 2d plateen was minned down by small arms fire 630 meters to the roar. The 1st platoon commenced an assault on the barlet to the North from which Co E (-) was receiving fire. The 1st platoon rulled back to a tree line and fired 5 - 3.5 WP and 4 LAAF rds. Co E (-) recomited 50 cal fire from the rear at this time. The 1st plateen began compler assault and ran into a nortar barrage and 50 cal fire from cound (22 180304). The plateon mushed on thru the hamlet and set up period or defense at coord (BT 125314). In the assault on the hamlet Co E received 6 Wa's. At 092330H the 2d ploteen frught its way into the defensive parimeter. At 092345H Co E moved with Co L and the Bn CP to coord (TT 123:13) and set in a night defensive perimeter.

.t 100930H Co L, Co E and the Bn CP moved to Hill 43 and relieved what was left of the ALVE Bn defending Hill 43. At 191300H Co G and 3d plateen of Co E joined the battalian on Hill 43. At 101400H the bettalian moved Mosterly towards Hill 63. The 3d Bn, 3d Marines occuried and set up a defensive perimeter of Hill 63 coord (BT 083325) at 101700H. At 110800H Co E conducted a commany size matrol to the West of Hill 63. At coord (BT 075324) Co Taliscovered a fortified hill and tunnel complex with air vents for cooking and providing fresh air to the tunnel complex. There were four foot tunnels 10 feet below the surface - rooms to accomodate 75 people. Due to insufficient demolitions to distrov the complex it was loft intact. Co E returned to Hill 63 at 111430H. At 120900H Co E was helilifted to an LZ coord (BT 144295) and secured the LZ for the landing of the remaining lements of the Bn. Co E provided CP security for night defense at corrds (BT 142291). At 1308008 moved into PMCUC MA valley in a search and estroy mission and to evaluate a B-52 bother strike on 12 December. Search and destroy missions were conducted on 13, 14, 15 and 16 Doca ber. Paragraph 3 of this remort lists the sumplies and equirment found by the battalien during the operation. At 170005H the battalien concentenced movement out of PHCUC HA valley to Highway 1, with Co E as rear guard. At coords (BT 152300) Co E was fired upon by suall arms from the right flank. Returned fire with 3.5 HP rounds, rifle and machine gun fire killing 2 VC. HU-IE gunshirs were called for an air strike. Co E received no casualties. Continued movement to corne (BT 176314) and set in defensive perimet r for the night. At 180800 the Dn commenced helilift to coords (BT 238314). Co E was last to be lifted At 181130H the Bn was noved by truck convey to the IS con' arrived at 181235H. At 181430H Co E was helilifted from the LSA to 2/9 CP coords. (AT 992672) and was CHOF from OpCon 3d Bn, 3d Mar.

c. Company G. 2d Bn. 9th Har. 091230H departed 3d Bn. 3d Marines CF for LSA. Arrived LSA at 091630H. No enemy contact enroute. 091645H commany was helilifted to LZ coord (BT 143307). Helilift completed at 091830H. Established defensive positions for the night. 3d plateon, To B remained in defensive resitions in the LZ throughout the night. Emper fire received at 091700H. No enemy contact during the night. Commany departed IZ at 100730H and arrived at Hill 43 coard (NT 124320) At 101300H. Departed Hill 43 at 101430H enroute to Hill 63 coord (BT 083325) acriving at 101700H. Contact was established with MEVN' unit at coord (BT 095332) at 101600H. Defensive resitions were established for the Fight. On 11 December remained in defensive resitions around Hill 63. On 120930H the company was helilifted to LZ court (BT 145285). At 1211704 4 VC dressed in utilities and steel helments were so n neving East at and (BT 145289). One was killed with one shot from sniper rifle at a range of 700 meters. The commany was assigned the mission of securing 1311 180 corrd (OT 139275). Movement by foot to Hill 180 from the TZ proved to be immssible due to wide river andan estimated VC force well positioned and dug in on the far side of the river. The company received small arms fire, automatic wearons fire, and morter fir from the for said of the river vicinity coord (BT 142280). Supporting arms were directed on the enemy force. The commany conflucted a orderly withdraval behind a screen of MP suche. Two friendly "IA's were sustained.

At 121800H initial elements of the commany were helilifted from the 17 coard (BT 145285) to the objective on Hill 180. Light small arms fire was received and quickly neutralized. The helilift was concluted at approximately 121830H and night defensive resitions were established. At 121830H 18-20 VC were seen moving East at coord (PT 150275) and were brought under artillery fire. We other contact was made during the re-Aminder of the night. 13 December maintained defensive resitions on Hill 100 and natrolled base of hill. 14 December conducted search matrols which two plateens to courd (BT 126268). Results of equipment and surplies found during all scarches is included in margraph 3 of this remrt. We energy contact. One VCS taken. Returned to Hill 180 and assumed might defensive resitions. 15 December remained on Hill 180 in defense. Sent one plateen on search patrol to village coord (9T 142289). At 1499 the search platoon received small arms fire from chord (BT 147283). Fire was neutralized and enemy contact broken. Patrol returned to Hill 180. 16 December search matrols continued. On 170730H the commany demarted Hill 180 and proceeded as the lead element of a foot march towards High ay 1 until approximately 171630H when reaching the SUCI PHU XUAN River which was impassable. Defended mertion of Bn marimeter coord (BT 175313) during the night with no enemy contact. Morning of 18 December moved by helicenter from coord (BT 175313) to (BT 236314). From there the company was trucked to ISA and then helilifted to the 2/9 CP at 181530H and CHOP 3d Bn, 3d Mar.

d. Company G, 2d Bn. 4th Mor. At 151500H Co G relieved Co I of the defensive perimeter of Hill 100 coords (BT 128286) and set in for the night. At 160730H Co G confucted a search and destroy overation to the Northeast of Hill 100 Vicinity PHOUC H/ (1) (BT 130290) and DOWG AT (2) (BT 134293). No on my contact was made. They destroyed approximately 10 tens of rice on' found a small amount of medical supplies which were evacuated to District Headquarters at OUE SON. Company returned to Hill 100 at approximately 161300H an' resumed the defensive perimeter. At 170300H the battalian communeed a tactical march to Highway 1 with Co G in trace of Co G 2d Bn, 9th Mar. At 171530H the battalien reached courd (BT 179313) and was unable to cross a swift, swollen and doen river. Co was helilifted from (BT 179313) to vicinity TUAN DUCKE (2) coord (BT 234314) and set in a defensive regimeter for the night. At 181005H, 3d Bn, 3d Mar and boarded trucks for a mother convey Ce G was CHOP South to re-join their morent unit.
