PART II NAMMATIVE SUMMANY

From 1 to 39 December, the Battalian (-) continued in its mission to defend the Cam Lo Artillery Base and Cam Lo Bridge positions in the Ninth Marines AO. Routine activities consisted of security patrols, ambushes, Tyo Marker construction and measures to ensure security and control of traffic on MSR 561 between the Cam Lo Artillery Base and Con Thien. The battalian was also assigned the responsibility for Tyo Marker construction at the C-3 position. An extensive program was initiated to sandbag and apply back fill and burster layers to bunkers in accordance with the Dye Marker TJan specifications.

On 5 December India Company returned to the battalion after being OF CON to the 11th Engineer Battalien since 27 November 67. The Battalion (-) on 11 December conducted a sweep and clear operation which was conducted in the area of Van Quat Xa and Van Ba Thung vicinity of coordinates Y7 110610. Although encuy ammunition and equipment were found, contact with the enemy was not made. On 12 becomber Mike Company was chonned from GPOOH 3/3 to GPOON 3/4 to assist that unit in manning their lines and then returned the following day. The remainder of the month the battalion participated in several joint operations with MNN and IF units, without caining contact with the energ. On 26 December Mike Company (Rein) changed from C XON 3/5 to OFOON 12th Marinos and Filo Cornary (Roin) returned to OFCOF 5/3 from OFCON 12th Marines. On the 29th and 30th of December the Battalion (-) left the Cam Lo Artillary Base (6-3) and Cam To William (6-34) to occupy the A-3 position. The movement was by vehicle to a point south of Gio Linh, from which point a tectical move to the 4-3 position was conjunted. The move was completed the afternoon of 30 Describer and negative energy contact was made. The battalion established a daily routine of heavy satroling and ambushos to ensure security of the A-3 position. Also an extensive program was initiated to sandbag and back fill all. builders in accordance with the Dye Markor Plan specifications.

The battalion established a civic action program at the C-3 and C-3A positions consisting of Med Caps and the hiring of Vietnemese people to fill sandbags for bulger and oil. Also or Christmas Day a party was held for a large number of children of Can Thi village.

PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. Combat Missions Assigned:

- a. Basic Mission. To conduct missions in assigned area of operations in accordance with 3d Mar Div Operation Order 59-67 (Kentucky).
- b. On 11 December 1967, 3d Battalion, 3d Marines mission was to seize Objectives 1, 2, 3, and 5 and to be prepared to search adjacent villages on order; destroy all fortifications encountered; provide assistance and security for attached Hoi Chan personnel by assisting in search operations and taking custody of identified VCS. Reference: Battalion Frag Order 60-67.
- c. On 29 and 30 December, the Battalion () (Rein) displaced to A-3 and assumed control of that position from 1/3. On assumption of the A-3 position conduct reconnaissance and screening operations and provide security for engineer elements. Reference: Battalion Frag Crder 61-57.

2. Significant Operations Conducted.

- a. On 11 December 1967 the Battalion (-) (Pein) left the Cam Io Artillery Base (C-3) and Cam Io Bridge (C-34) positions and proceeded west towards Battalion Objectives 1, 2, 3 and 5. On seizure of Objectives 1,2, and 3 and, on order, Lima Company (-) (Rein) secured Objective 5 and established a blocking position criented to the north and work to ocver India Companys sweep south. On order, India Company commenced sweep and clear operations south passing forward of the blocking forces. Enemy ordnance and equipment were uncovered but contact with the enemy was negative. The battalion returned to C-3 and C-3A positions at 1600H.
- o. On 13 December 1967, Lima Company left the Cam Lo Bridge position and established a blocking position in vicinity of grid square YD1861 in conjuction with PF and RF operations to the east. There was negative enougy contact.
- the 0.5 position to assist 3/4 as a blocking force while 3/4 made a sweep south. Vegative enemy contact was made.
- d. On 22 Documer 1967, India Company departed C-3 position to establish a blocking position at YD 163610 in conjunction with an ARVN sweep to the east. On 23 December 1937, Idma Company left the Cam Lo Bridge (C-3A) and commenced movement to Battalion Objective #2

at coordinates In 165605 also in conjunction with the ARTW sweet to the east. At 1500H, both units returned to their respective positions. Regative enemy contact was made during the operation.

e. On 29 Pecember 1967, Lima and India Companies and Command Group Alpha departed Cam Lo Artillery Base (C-3) and the Cam Lo Bridge (C-3A) positions for movement to the A-3 position. The move was made by vehicle to a point south of Gio Linh, and by tactical march into A-3. On 30 December 1967, Kilo Company and Command Group Brave left the C-3 and C-3A positions for their move to A-3. Their move to A-3 was completed in the same manner as the first units. Both movements were uneventful and with negative enemy contact.

3. Casualties Inflicted on the Enemy.

The battalion inflicted no casualties on the energ during the month of December.

7. Equipment. On 27 and 28 December the battalion replaced all M-16 rifles with a new modified M-16 rifle. The replacement of weapons were exchanged on a rifle for rifle besis by a mobile contact team.

8. Logistics.

a. Supply.

- (1) General. While at the C-3 and C-34 positions the battalion maintained an adequate supply of all classes of supply. A daily resupply maintained it at this level, plus providing the battalion with mail and TP packs, when available. There were no problems encountered in getting the battalion resupplied. On 29 December the battalion moved to the A-3 position. At the present time is in the process of building up its stocks to 5 days for Class I and V items. A daily resupply by helicopter is the only means this battalion has to transport its gear and personnel to A-3. The weather has been the only problem of resupplying the battalion and has had a large effect on being able to get helicopters out to resupply that position.
- (2) Class I while at the C-3 and C-31 positions the battalion maintained a 7 day supply of C-rations. A daily resupply maintained it at that level. It the A-3 position the battalion is building up its stocks to a five day supply and a daily resupply by helicopter to maintain it at that level.
- (3) Class II There still remains a shortage in jungle utilities, sizes small and X-small; jungle boots sizes, 8V, 9R, and 10V.
- (4) Class III No problems encountered in keeping an adequate supply of POL on hand.
- (5) Class IV Due to operation Dyo Marker, no problems have been encountered in obtaining Class IV items.
- (6) Class V The battalion supply of Class V items was adequate and a daily resupply maintained it at a minimum level of BA plus 5 days white at the Cam Lo Artillory Base. The battalion is in the process of building up its stocks of Class V at our new position at A-3.

b. Motor Transport.

(1) The battalions present status is considered adequate on M7442's (Mules) for current operations the our present status on the

c. Engineer Assistance.

(1) 11th Engineers commenced clearing an area for the emplacement of a mine field and wire obstacles according to Operation Dye Marker specifications at the C-3 position. Engineer support required to assist in construction of Dye Marker bunkers has been informally requested through appropriate channels.

d. Maintenance Problems.

9. Civio otion.

Civic action for the month of December was concentrated on Med Caps, traffic control along MRR 561 and the hiring of Vietnamese laborers for the filling of sandbags for Dye Marker bunkers.

Nine Med Caps were held during the month and a total of 8%6
Victnamese people were treated for various-minor gilments. Two locations have been established for regular Med Caps within the Cam Thi area. The battalion surgeon held a Med Cap each Tuesday and Thursday and gave assistance to the District Tealth Chief. At YD 148607, a permenent shelter was creeted for Med Caps to be held on Wednesday and Saturday of each week.

During the first helf of the month, Vietnamese labor was hired to fill sandbags that were needed at the C-3 position. However the program was discontinued for the lack of oil and bulgar with which to pay the laborars.

The biggest problem encountered during this reporting period remained the control of traffic between Route 9 and C-3 along MSR 561. Two serious incidents involving U.3. military vehicles resulted in the 1 this of two Vietnamese people. The parent organizations involved were notified and they took action as necessary. The battalion has posted speed signs along the MSR and the road is patroled periodically. A prominent MP patrol has been recommended for that section of the MSR.

Other incidents for this period of a minor nature involved the engineers accidential uncovering of a cemetary and damage to a civilian boat by an external load dropped accidentally by a helicopter.

Both incidents were resolved promptly at the time of the incident to the satisfaction of all concerned.

On Christmas Day a small party was held at the Cam Thi village market place at YD 147602. Cookies, candy and kool and were served to 400 Vietnamese children. The reception was friendly and hospitable.

10. Mainistration.

- a. An awards coromony was held on the 25th of December. The below listed medals were presented to members of this battalion to Brigadier General M TZGER, Assistant Commander, 3d Marine Division:

- b. A total of 7 Court Martials were held during December: 5 SPCM and 2 SCH. No Court Martials are pending. Five Battalion Commander's Office Hours were completed and none are pending. There were five Company Commander's Office Hours completed and four are parling.
- c. Special Services provided stationery during the month of December. Free beer was provided on 28 December. Various Christmas gifts received from the American Red Cross and the USO, were distributed to members of the battalion by Special Services.
- d. Post Exchange services were available to all companies of the battalion during the regular Dong Ha exchange runs to C-3 and Gio Linh during the month of December.
 - c. Liberty was not authorized during this period.
- f. During the month one officer and 75 onlisted Marines rotated to CONUS. 5 Officers and 41 enlisted word transferred within the regiment or division. 23 enlisted Marines were transferred as a result of medical evacuation.

- e. Emergency leave for the month of December: 1 USMC Officer, 2 USMC enlisted. There were no Humanitarian Transfers during the month of December. Twice/thrice wounded or reassigned outside of RVN due to father/brother in country: 5 USMC enlisted.
- f. There were no Hardship Discharges applied for during the past month. None are pending.
 - g. One Administrative Discharge is pending.
- h. The R&R Program continues to be a major morale factor within this command. There were 31 In-Country and 68 Out of Country R&R quotas used during this reporting period.
 - i. Morale is considered to be excellent to outstanding.
- j. Postal services during the month of December has been excellent, with 3 to 5 mail pick-ups per day from the Post Office in Dong Ha. Mail was broken down into each company and delivered to the forward echelons the same day it was picked up.

12. Intelligence.

During the month of December there were numerous sightings of enemy troops and intelligence reports from Vietnamese villagers. On 3 and 4 December there were a total of 5 MA bodies recovered by the battalion in the Cam In River and it was remorted from the District Headquarters that villagers found six more bodies. All the bodies had wounds and bruises on the face and head. The tattalion surgeon reported that the bodies died of these wounds and not of drowning. Papers and clothes found on the bodies confirmed by the District Headquarters of Cam In was that villagers for their up the river had beaten the soldiers to death and had thrown the rebodies into the river.

On 11 December, three or panies exept the western portion of the Battalions A.O. The sweep was conducted with the support of a Paychological Warfare armed Propaganda Team from the Quang Tri Chieu Hoi center. A company of RF's from the District Headquarters of Cam Lowas also moved to the battalions southand countary as a blocking force.

During the sweep India Company uncovered a shelter which was well comealed from ground and air observation. The Armed Propagands Team was used to search the shelter and surrounding area and recovered three weapons and an assortment of enemy ordnance and equipment. Approximately 100 meters from the shelter the A.P.T. located and disarmed a booby trapped mire.

There was one mine and one booby trap incident during the reporting period. On 13 December a Marine from Lima Company stepped on a mine at coordinates YD 166616 and on 23 December two Vietnamese boys were injured by a booby trap at coordinates YD 165617. Both the mine and booby trap could not be indentified. Also both incidents occurred near the village of Cam Vn on a known infiltration route.

Many of the enemy sightings during the month of December were in the areas adjacent to the 3/3 MO and could not be exploited by the battalian. On 21 December, a 3/3 Kit Carson Scout reported that he recieved information from a villager that the NVA crossed the Cam Lo River at YD 175608 and were asking for details on the Cam Lo Bridge position and CAP units to the south.

On 28 December a helicopter received automatic weapons fire from grid square YD 1860. One Marine on a 3/3 advence party to A-3 was killed.

An increase in enemy sightings to the northwest, northeast and southeast indicate that the enemy is actively reconsitering the area and sometimes uses civilians for this purpose. Sightings increased in frequency and unit sizes increased also towards the end of the month.

15. Comminications.

- a. General. During the month of December the Commencations Section ran the whre and radio systems necessary for the battalion to operate. At the Com Lo Artillery Base there were an increased number of radio nets for the Communication Section to guard. The Communications Section also operated three SB-22's and had overheaded all the internal CP wire. In late December the battalion moved to A-3 maintaining communications between the advance party, bettalion and the battalion roar as much as possible.

 At 4-3 an extensive reviring program was initiated.
- b. Training. The battalion is continually cross-training wire and ratio people as they enter the Communications Section. Also several communications classes were held in the Battalion NCO School by the communications personnel. In late December the plateon held a four day extensive wire course for two members of each rifle company.
- c. Problem Areas. Personnel in the 2542 and 2511 occupational fields are becoming critical. Tape antennas and bases for the PRC-25 continue to be in short supply and replacement for Code "X"ed, PRC-25 radios are still hard to obtain.
- d. Equipment Status. The battalien has received two PRC-25's from the Dye Marker stocks in addition to the wire equipment received last month. The following is a list of major combat equipment that is not operationally ready:

14. <u>Weather</u>. The weather for December was generally cool and fair with sporadic rains at the first part of the month and increasing in frequency toward the end of the month. The average high temperature was 76 degrees with an average low of 65 degrees. The normal heridity was 85% with 12.61 inches of rain recorded. The wind was generally from the morth at an average second of 9 knots. Visibility averaged 8 miles.

15. Fire Support.

a. During the month of December the majority of missions fired were of a practice nature, suspected enemy positions, and suspected enemy observation posts. The live fire missions that came through the tattalion were relays from a C.C unit south of the attalions AC.

On 29 December the battalion moved from the Cam Lo Artillery Base and Can In Bridge to the A-3 position. Missions fired at the new position consisted of close defensive fires with the remainder of missions being practice in nature.

16. Air Support

A. During the month of December there was a limited use of air support. Air contributions by the First Marine Air Wing consisted of medical evacuations, logistic and troop helicopter lifts, recon overflights, aerial observation and TPQ - 10 missions.

b. Recon overflights and aerial observation aircraft were used by the battalion while conducting operations from the Cam Lo positions.

Approximately 40 Corporals and L/Cols attended the courses of instruction. It was planned to conduct more classes but due to operational commitments and planned move to A-3 position it was not practicable to continue the school.

A comy of the two NCO Schools Training Schedules is enclosed in Part IV of the chronology.

The companies conducted daily training in basic military subjects. Subjects stressed were patrolling, map and compass reading, radio procedures and forward observer procedures.

On 27 and 28 December the battalion recieved new M-16 rifles and immediately conducted familiarization firing and zeroing of weapons prior to planned move to A-3. Also in late December a wire school was held for ten selected men from the rifle companies.




