

PART II

MARRATIVE SUMIARY

During the month of November, the change of AO brought a new type of enemy activity. Enemy-initiated activity consisted primarily of attacks by fire, mining of the MSR, and hasty ambushes of opportunity along the MSR. The Battalian has patrolled the AO and made significant ground contact once. It is evident that the enemy in our 4O is VC-oriented and is definitely not willing to or capable of meeting us on the ground.

The western portion of the AO was covered by as resive patrolling. Control of the eastern portion was hampered by VC mining and ambushing of the MR. The Battalion conceived a counter-ambush plan and has not been ambushed since. Wight ambushes were increased to counteract the mining of the MSR.

The Battalion reported numerous signs of activity in the DMZ, consisting of lights at night and sightings and contacts made by Recon teams.

(a) The Battalion had no problems in the resupply of Class V. Although the Quang Tri AP was out of Simm He rounds for 4 days, the Battalion had an adequate reserve and there was no adverse effect on the Battalion's combat capabilities. The Class V problem which faced the Battalion during the period was the turn-in of ammunition left behind by units previously occupyin A-4, C-2, and C-3. This included both grade III and good ammunition. Approximately 150 tons of ammunition were taken from the above mentioned positions to the AF's at Yong Ha and Guang Tri.

(3) Resumply

- c. The R&R program continues to be a major morele factor within the battalion. There were 72 out of country R*R quotas and 29 in country R*R quotas used during this month.

On 1 Nov the Bn moved from Camp Carroll to Con Thien with half of the Bn at C-2. The month of Nov Ancountered several contacts with the enemy. The size of the enemy during the contact varied from fire toam to squad size. On 3 Nov 21304 K/3/3 IP spotted A personnel north east on hill 561 in vic YD132665. Throw frag grenad is and fired M-79. Pulled in IP. Unknown results. At 1011307 N/3/3 observed 4 NVA vic T0057656. Took enemy under fire with small arms. dearch area and found old bunker complex vic YDO58654. Results of contact were nagative. At 111550H 1/3/3 had contact with approx 15 NV 4 with small arms and automatic weapons vic YD082638. Arty MSN was called. Posults ware unknown. At 2011007 K/3/3 spotted 2 enemy vic YD114626. Fired on onemy with small arms killing 1. ID card on the body stated that the enemy was from the 1st Company, 3d Battalion, 2 th MYA (IDD) Regiment. On 251920H L/3/3 snotted 6-8 enemy moving north on the road vic YD115697. Called artillary and fired 60mm mortars with unknown results. On 26 11 30H K/3/3 spotted 4-5 enemy wearing brown camouflaged utilities vic TDO89642. Fire on enemy and enemy returned fire with negative regults.

The Bn had several mine incidents during the month of Mov. On 070912H 1/3/3 walked into a mine field vic YD132617. Also at 070930H detenated anti-tank mine which was richted as enti-personn I mine on the road. Called mine sweeter for road vic YD132517. Tegative results. There was a notable increase in 122mm rocket, 82mm mortar, and 60mm mortar during the month. Incident on 1010309 the Ba received 16 rounds incoming estimated 75mm Recoiless Rifle fire from vic Y7165705, YY63702, and YDO80675. Arty could not be called because of air traffic. On 1013304 3/3 received 18 rounds of 122mm rockets from vic YDO35695, YD033679, YD080700, and YD063702. On 1611254 3/3 at C-2 received 2 rounds incoming 60mm and 82mm mortars from vic V7103669. The enemy also ambushed the MSR several times. On 081245H K/3/3 observed truck receiving 2 rounds small arms fire from vic Y 133638. 4t 161345H 3/3 vehicles received approx 15 rounds of sniper fire from east of road vic Y0137620. At 171030H 3/3 vehicle enroute from south to Con Thion vic Y7133632 was ambushed. On 181725H I/3/3 truck vic Y7132528 was ambushed from both sides of road, receiving 30-50 rounds of 30cal fire and 3 RPG rounds. Colled arty and gunships. Area was checked with magative results. On 191445H I/3/3 vehicles were taken under fire by SAF REG and hand granades vic YD133624 to YD127622. 75-150 rounds of St and RoG and Dok number of granades. Spotted 5-8 enemy west of road. Arty MW was called and fire was returned with IAF and 50cal.

Mumorous bunkers were found during Nov. At 191645H K/3/3 found camp area recently occupied by large unit vic YD086656. Also fresh trails and 30 fighting holes. There was also fresh blood and bandages in area. On 261020H K/3/3 found 2 old bunkers at least 6 me old in vic YD088634. Also 20 meters north K/3/3 found elaborate system of trenches in a zig-zag fashion. Approx 25 meters up trail vic YD088634 found numerous name plates with the following information:

NGUYEN BA LINH V3-74
TRAN VAN MU V3-73
TRAN HUY CU V3-71

Wany lights were observed by the Bn's OP's. Vic YP172820, YP172807, YP142798, and YP125799. The month of Mov again indicated the enemy's desire to build up and occupy positions in the 3d Marines MO. The sighting of lights within the DMZ indicates that the enemy are taking advantage of the present bombing halt by utilizing the PMZ.

The forward command nost was moved from Camp Carroll to 4-4 and G-2. Communication assets were divided between each CP. Electrical power was nonexistant at both positions and an engineer team was dispatched to install permanent exterior electrical wiring: Two generators were obtained. A 20km for C-2 and a 30km for 4-4. Project 972 equipment was used to support communication assets at A44. 3d Mar assigned a TEC-27 radio relay team to 4-4 for

land-line communications between 1-4 and Camp Carroll. Radio Rolay could not be obtained for C-2.

- b. Co I Previde 1 reinferced plateen for security of positions C-3.

- c. Companies operating in western portion will send absolutely minimum radio traffic. Situation reports at U-S-M-C times will consist of brief acknowledgement of radio check from Bn CCC. Send spot reports when necessary.
- d. Routine night and day activities for eastern portion will be reported to Bn COC by 1600H daily.
- e. All units submit spot reports ASAP. Do not delay. Use initial, then final format.
- f. Current standard brevity codes, formats, COI, and thrust points will be used.

1. SUMMARY OF ENEMY SITUATION

a. The area to the west of the 86th grid line has been occupied to a very limited extent by friendly forces. Trails indicated on Appendix (1) are the result of a limited Reconnaisance effort combined with aerial observers and aerial photo read—outs. This trail overlay is not complete; heavy canope precludes decisive estimates. A POW captured on 11 October is from the 57th Regt. of the 304th Div., one of the units involved in the KHE SANH seige. The POW indicated that LANG HO (XD774567) is a storage area and also stated that rice caches and aid stations are located in the area to the west. See Appendix (1) for bunker complexes, etc.

2. TERRAIN

a. The area in our new AO is essentially virgin country. With
the exception of the northeastern portion of our AO, friendly
intelligence has been minimal. The terrain is extremely steep,
inclined to be slick and resistant to ground movement during
the wet season. The terrain will likely be rocky, necessitating
extremely sure footing. There will be numerous cross compartments and streams not indicated on the map. Streams are likely
to be unfordable. Deep draws will hamper communications.

3. WEATHER

a. Weather during the upcoming operation to the west will make resupply, medevacs, and stream fording difficult and even hazardous. Carrying wounded or sick personnel will slow down movement considerably. November is the transitional month between the Southwest and Northwest monsoons. Approximately 15-20 days per month will receive heavy rains which will inundate ordinarily trafficable regions.
