# NARRATIVE SECURY

The Battalion continued assigned operations on Operation Taylor Common. Company patrol bases and Fire Support Bases were established and maintained. Small unit point contacts were frequent, but no large scale, organized reststance was encountered. Tumerous bunker complexes and rest areas were discovered and were destroyed. These complexes were unoccupied and for the most part, had been so for several weeks. Mumerous weapons and sumply caches were also uncovered.

On the 15th of February, the Battalion commenced retrograde operation via an Hoa to Quang Tri Combat Base. On 20 February, the Battalion assumed 2d Bn, 3d Marines 40 with the Battalion CP located in Com Lo. Enemy contact was sporadic. There were several morter and rocket incidents and the Engineers frequently located mines on Route 49.

(2) During the month of February, the first 15 days Class " was drawn from the LSU 'n Hos with no problems encountered. After the 15th, Class V was drawn from 'SP at Quang Tri. A shortage of Claymore mines and M79 WE rounds was encountered.

# b. Resupply

During the first 15 days of February, resumply was by helicoptor. There were no problems concerning resumply during this period. From the 15th on, resumply was by ground transportation with no problems encountered.

# c. Evacuation & Hospitalization

- (1) Trees of operation during Taylor Common were mountainous terrain with double canopy. In the Kentucky O, terrain is flat with little to no cover.
- (2) All medevecs were by helicopters and no problems were encountered.

# d. Transportation

- (1) Total mileage on organic vehicles during February was 6167 miles.

# e. Sarvice

- (1) During Operation Taylor Common and until 15 Tabruar, one platoon of Co B, 3d Engineer Pattalion rendered assistance in all engineering tasks. Heavy equipment was unobtainable.
- (2) During the rest of the reporting period, the same platoon conducted road sweeps in the Kentucky 'O for the Sattalion.
- (3) During the first 15 days of Pebruary, the Battelion was supported by 4 HST's from 34 Shore Farty Battelion.

# 12. INTELLIGECE

- a. During the first half of the month, the Battalion continued to participate in Operation Taylor Common. As reported in the pravious reporting period, enemy contact continued to be point contacts with units of 4-6 men and no all out resistance was encountered. Several bunker and hut complexes were found along with numerous weapons, food and supply caches. These caches indicated that the enemy probably intended to return to the area. There were two (2) incidents of TAB's and units getting hit by morter, but it is believed that the enemy could not sust in such attacks because of loss of sumpliss. On the 19th of the month, the Bettelion returned north to onerste Quang Tri, Cam Lo, and Mai Loc areas during T'T. During this period, one (1) heavy contect indicated that possibly they were proporing for a mojor offensive. This was substantiated by numerous exent reports and radio intercepts. There were several instances of rocket and morter attacks indicating the possibility of numerous emounts of supply in the area. Mine sweep terms have uncovered many mines being laid on the MSR's by the enemy in the area.
- b. Scout/Sniper Teams could not be used effectively in the area of An Hoa because of the heavy folioge. In the Cam Lo area, they could be put to better use because of large fields of fire.
- c. Kit Carson Scouts were considered a big help in patroling, however, the quality of WCT received during Operation Taylor Common was very moor.
- d. Interpreters were considered big help during the reporting period, however, the Bettelion was unable to obtain - sufficient number to put to optimum use.

e. Dog Teams helped the Battalion greatly during the reporting period. But, like interpreters, are in short supply.

# 13. COMMUNIC TIONS

- a. From 1-15 February, during Operation Taylor Common, communication over difficult terrain was excellent using the Antenna, AS-2236. The AS-2236 provided FM, VHF communications from the Alpha Command Group in the field direct to the Battalion Rear at Nam O Bridge, 40 miles away.
- b. Over the flat lands of our new 'O, communications were good using the 45-22% and HC-292 antennas. Switchboards and telephones were installed in the Alpha Command's new CP at Cam Lo District Head-quarters and the Battalion Rear at Tuang Tri. The wire section, also installed wire systems at Con Thien and C2 until the US 'rmy moved into these positions at the end of the month.
- c. At the end of the month, plans were formed to establish more direct telephone communications with the Battalion Rear in Quang Tri using the TRC-27B and existing trunks between Done Ha and Quang Tri.
- d. One of the main problems encountered in the new AO has been that of numerous overides. Often different battalions have been assigned the same frequencies. Hormally, cooperation between the overiding stations permitted continued operation on these frequencies. In rare cases frequencies were changed. Mutual interference between the 27 antennas in the Cam Lo CP was common. Remoting antennas using the W/GRA-39 or shifting frequencies within the Battalion seemed to be the only solutions to this problem.

# JOHRNAL STPHARY

Of Feb 69 1415H In the area of 20061315, a patrol of Co L found 12 huts and several spider traps and tunnels. A search of the area uncovered scraps of paper that were sent to S-2. The area had not been used for 3-4 weeks and was destroyed.

1520H In the area of 20061316, a patrol of Co L found 15 huts with bunkers undermeath and several fighting holes. The area had eating facilities and was near a stream and after searching was destroyed.

- 02 Feb 69 1130H In the area of 20060308, a patrol of Co L found the 3 Recon bodies and assorted goar left in the area.
- 03 Feb 69 095 Ft In the area of 20171298, a patrol of Co I made point contact with 4 enemy, who fired on patrol wounding 1. Fire was returned and artillery was called in with negative results.
- 04 Feb 69 1800H In the area of 20147285, FSB Dart and Co I received 6-7 rounds of 82mm mortar fire. All rounds landed outside the perimeter. Counter mortar fire was used with unknown results.
- 05 Feb 69 1330H In the area of 20168284, a patrol of Co I found 4 fighting holes and the impression left by an 82mm mortar hase plate. Area was destroyed.

1500H In the area of 2081254, a patrol of Co K found a complex of 22 huts and 21 bunkers that were about 12 years old. Also found a grave with a fence around it, whose occupant had died of natural causes. There were footprints 3 weeks old, but the area had not been used for about 6 months. The area was destroyed.

06 Feb 69 1005H In the area of 20071241, a patrol of Co K found 8 fighting holes set in a 360° perimeter and assorted WA equipment. The holes were about a week old and were destroyed.

1115H In the area of 20075247, a Marine of Co K patrol set off a booby trarmade from an M26 grenade resulting in 3 medovacs.

1345H In the area of 70140297, a patrol of Co I found 10 huts with bunkers underneath. Two were messhalls containing cooking utensils. Also found were enomy weapons, ammunition, and medical equipment. The weapons and equipment was sent to S-2 and the rest destroyed.

of Feb 69 1030H In the area of 20170287, a patrol of Co I made point contact with 3 enemy with automatic respons. Returned fire with unknown results. Searched area and fired Wi equipment.

1600H In the area of %C105347, a patrol of Co M found a complex of 4 huts and 4 bunkers with many trails leading from the area. The complex was 8 months old and had not been used within the last month. The area was destroyed.

08 Feb 69 In the area of 20185310, a Marine on patrol with Co I sat on an enemy mine and was killed.

0915H In the area of 20097399, a patrol of Co M made point contact with 5 enemy heading in the opposite direction. Fired on the enemy, killing 1. Searched the area and found enemy weapons and equipment.

1200H In the area of 20093346, a patrol of Co M found a complex of 9 huts, 1 messhall hut, 13 bunkers, and 3 latrines. The area was 5 months old and had been used with in the last week. The complex was destroyed.

1600M In the area of 20184316, a patrol of Co I found 33 pits for cooking. The pits could be covered to smoke food. The area had not been used recently and was destroyed.

1700H In the area of 70 184316, a patrol of Co M found a complex of 7 huts with bunkers underneath. I hut was a messhall and I was an aid station. In the huts were found enemy ammunition, farming tools, communications equipment, and other articles. Ever thing was destroyed.

09 Feb 69 0930H In the area of 70 189303, a patrol of Co I was taken under fire by an unknown number of enomy, while crossing a stream.

Returned fire with negative results.

1015H In the area of 20087346, a patrol of Co M found 8 huts with bunkers underneath, 1 hut was a messhell and 1 was an aid station. The area was 6-8 months old and had used within the last 3-4 days. The complex was destroyed.

1200 In the area of 20050314, a patrol of Co L found 3 huts containing a large amount of food and some clothing. The huts were destroyed.

1245H In the area of 20174285, a petrol of Company I was taken under fire by an automatic weapon and sustained 3 medewars. Returned fire and called in artillery with unknown results. Searched area and found 6 freshly dug fighting holes.

1430H In the area of 20171284, a patrol of Co I made point contact with 1 enemy, who opened fire on patrol killing 2 Marines. Patrol returned fire killing 1 TV; and capturing his rifle.

1730H In the area of %C177288, a patrol of Co I sighted 5 enemy moving along a trail. Called in artillery with unknown results.

1930H In the area of 20171283, Co I received 5-6 60mm mortar rounds from an unknown position. The rounds caused no injury.

2150H In the area of 20092337, an De of Co M heard movement in front of the lines. Marines threw consides with negative results other than 1 bouncing off a tree and injuring 2 Marines.

10 Feb 69 No significant events.

11 Feb 69 1300H In the eres of 20027255, a patrol of Co L made point contact with 2 enemy. Fired upon enemy with unknown results.

1330H In the area of 20064265, a patrol of Co K found a cultivated area with corn, banana trees, potatoes, and other assorted vegetables. Also found were 28 pigs that were being raised. The had been used recently and was destroyed.

12 Feb 69 0930H In the area of 20064265, a patrol of Co K found 2 huts containing Chinest maps and documents. The maps and documents were sent to S-2 and the huts destroyed.

1130H In the area of 20064269, a patrol of Co K found 3 huts and 2 bunkers. They also found 1 bamboo canoe, 5 empty 82mm mortar boxes, bicycle parts, and a cultivated area. Everything was destroyed.

1430H In the area of 2058316, a patrol of Co L found 3 graves with 1 female and 2 males. The graves were 3-6 months old.

Scarching the area uncovered 35 knap sacks, 13 maps, ammunition pouches, Chicom voltage meters, a whip antenna, 4 cans of grease, telegraph cable, 30 transformers, 3 NVA cartridge belts, 20 heavy duty fuses, and a small amount of food. The equipment was sent to S-2 and the rest destroyed.

13 Feb 69 1300H In the area of YC990344, a patrol of Co C, 2/5 found a grave with 1 body killed by artillery.

23274 In the area of YD182587, elements of the 106 Plt heard movement under the bridge. They threw 2 M26 grenades. Checked area with negative results.

1010H In the area of YD037564, a jeep in a convoy from VCB hit a mine and the jeep following it received automatic waspon fire

Also mortar fire was received from the YDO558 area. A platoon with mesection of tanks was sent to check out the area and found 25 Montagards, who were released.

1410H In the area of YD096613, a patrol of Co H, 2/3 discovered 13 60mm rounds, 1 empty can of increments, and 1 battle dressing wrapper.

OB15H In the area of VN148681, elements of Co K while in an ambush position observed 1 NVA. The ambush opened fire as another one appeared. 2 tanks and duster were called in to assist. Also called in artillary to block esaped routes. The units linked up and swent the area killing 4 NVA out of an estimated 10-15 enemy. Also found were pairs of utilities and jungle boots.
